A STUDY REQUEST

2	To the House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs to study the prevalence of
3	remote work among state employees and to investigate the impact of such work on
4	the economy and to report its findings to the House of Representatives prior to the
5	end of the committee's present term on January 8, 2024.
6	WHEREAS, many state departments, offices, and agencies implemented work-from-
7	home policies beginning in 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic; and
8	WHEREAS, many state offices continue to allow employees to work from home; and
9	WHEREAS, the decrease in the number of state employees working in the office on
10	a daily basis had a negative impact on local and state economies and public safety; and
11	WHEREAS, Louisiana lacks a comprehensive study of the impact of remote work
12	on local and state economies and public safety.
13	THEREFORE, the House of Representatives of the Legislature of Louisiana requests
14	that the House Committee on House and Governmental Affairs study the following and
15	report its findings to the House of Representatives prior to the end of the committee's present
16	term on January 8, 2024:
17	(1) The percentage of state employees that work from home reported on an average
18	daily basis and by location.
19	(2) The basis each department uses to determine remote working eligibility.
