Proposed law defines "surgical smoke plume".

Proposed law requires licensed healthcare facilities which provide surgical procedures using heat-producing equipment, including but not limited to electrosurgery and lasers, to adopt and implement policies for the use of a surgical smoke plume evacuation plan to mitigate and remove the surgical smoke plume.

Proposed law provides for the La. Department of Health to verify compliance with proposed <u>law</u> through onsite surveys that are specific to surgical services, full licensing surveys, full recertification surveys, and complaint surveys if allegations specific to surgical services are alleged.

Effective August 1, 2023.

- 2. Clarify that a healthcare facility's policy should implement a surgical smoke plume evacuation plan.
