HB 8 2023 Regular Session

SCHOOLS. Requires display of the national motto, "In God We Trust", in every public elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education classroom.

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> requires each public school governing authority to display the national motto, "In God We Trust", in each building it uses and in each school under its jurisdiction.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes this requirement <u>from</u> in each building and each school <u>to</u> in each classroom in each school.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that the nature of the display shall be determined by each governing authority with a minimum requirement of a paper sign. <u>Proposed law</u> deletes <u>present law</u> and instead requires that the motto:

- (1) Be displayed on a poster or framed document that is at least 11 inches by 14 inches.
- (2) Be the central focus of the poster or framed document.
- (3) Be printed in a large, easily readable font.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally requires such display of the national motto in every classroom in charter schools and on public postsecondary education institution campuses.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>proposed law</u> does not require spending public funds to purchase displays.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes governing authorities, management boards, and institutions to accept donated displays and to spend their funds or donated funds to purchase displays.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the provisions of <u>proposed law</u> to be applicable on and after August 1, 2026.
