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- 6 On page 2, delete lines 5 through 27 and on page 3, delete lines 1 through 19 and insert the 7 following:
- 8 "§1300.54. In-person visitation policies; requirements

9 A. The legislature intends that every patient in the care of a hospital, 10 nursing home, in-patient hospice facility, or licensed intermediate care facility for people with developmental disabilities shall be allowed visitation 11 12 from one caregiver at any time of the day while the patient is hospitalized or 13 in the care of the facility unless prevented by individual clinical 14 considerations. This visitation shall not impede surgical or emergencycentered intensive care procedures. A patient shall be allowed at least one 15 16 visitor during the course of a twenty-four hour day. Minors shall have the 17 right to have both parents or guardians in-person at all times unless prevented 18 by individual clinical considerations. A hospital, nursing home, in-patient 19 hospice facility, or licensed intermediate care facility for people with 20 developmental disabilities shall not be required to allow more than one 21 visitor, but shall make provisions for one primary caregiver to relieve 22 another.

B. In accordance with R.S. 40:2005, any person eighteen years or
 older may designate those individuals who will not be denied access to visit
 him in-person during any stay in any hospital, nursing home, or other
 healthcare facility within the state of Louisiana.

<u>C. In accordance with R.S. 40:2005.1, hospitals, nursing homes, and</u> adult residential care homes may allow members of the clergy to visit patients or residents during a public health emergency whenever a patient or resident or the legal or designated representative of the patient or resident requests the visit. Special consideration shall be given to patients or residents receiving end-of-life care.

D. In accordance with R.S. 40:2009.4, licensed nursing facilities may
 allow immediate family members and other designated persons to visit
 residents during a public health emergency whenever a resident or the legal
 or designated representative of the resident requests the visit. Special
 consideration shall be given to residents receiving end-of-life care.

38E. In accordance with R.S. 40:2166.5, licensed adult residential care39providers may allow immediate family members and other designated40persons to visit residents during a public health emergency whenever a41resident or the legal or designated representative of the resident requests the42visit. Special consideration shall be given to residents receiving end-of-life43care.

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1	F. In accordance with R.S. 40:2180.2, licensed intermediate care
2	facilities for people with developmental disabilities (ICF/DD) may allow any
3	close family member or legal representative of a resident of an ICF/DD to
4	visit the resident during any state of public health emergency."
