Existing law (R.S. 33:1375) provides maximum fines that may be imposed in New Orleans for violations of city ordinances. <u>Prior law provided that the maximum fines were \$500 for a first offense and \$1000 for a subsequent offense.</u>

<u>Prior law</u> (R.S. 13:2500(C)) also provided relative to the penalties that could be imposed by the Municipal and Traffic Court of New Orleans. Provided that court could impose penalties not to exceed \$500 or six months in jail, or both.

<u>New law</u> consolidates the two statutory provisions, increases the maximum fines to \$1,000 for a first offense and \$2,000 for a subsequent offense, and retains the six month maximum on imprisonment for a violation of a city ordinance.

<u>Prior law</u> authorized the Municipal and Traffic Court of New Orleans to impose up to an additional 30 days in jail for anyone in default of the payment of a fine. <u>New law</u> repeals prior law.

Effective August 1, 2023.
