2	To amend and reenact R.S. 9:4802(C), relative to the Private Works Act; to provide for
3	cases in which a homeowner is relieved of claims; and to provide for related matters.
4	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
5	Section 1. R.S. 9:4802(C) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
6	§4802. Improvement of immovable by contractor; claims against the owner and
7	contractor; privileges securing the improvement
8	* * *
9	C. The owner is relieved of the claims against him under this Section and the
10	privileges securing them when the claims arise from the performance of a contract
11	by a general contractor for whom a and either of the following occur:
12	(1) A bond is given and maintained as required by R.S. 9:4812 and when
13	notice of the contract with the bond attached is properly and timely filed as required
14	by R.S. 9:4811.
15	(2) The general contractor has been paid in full.

Abstract: Provides an exception to the Private Works Act to relieve the homeowner from claims against him.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a homeowner is relieved of claims under the Private Works Act and the privileges securing them when the claims arise from the performance of a contract by a general contractor for whom bond is given and maintained and when notice of contract with the bond attached is properly and timely filed.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to provide that the homeowner is also relieved of the claims against him under the provisions of <u>present law</u> when the general contractor has been paid in full.
