ELECTIONS: (Constitutional Amendment) Provides relative to the time at which certain officials are elected

1	A JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Proposing to amend Article III, Section 4(C), Article IV, Section 3(A) and (D), Article V,
3	Sections 27, 28(A), and 29, Article VII, Section 24(A), and Article VIII, Section
4	3(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana and to repeal Article VIII, Section 15 of the
5	Constitution of Louisiana, to provide relative to the timing of elections of certain
6	officials; to provide for the election of state legislators, statewide elected officials,
7	members of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, sheriffs, clerks
8	of court, coroners, and tax assessors; to provide for elections to be held at times
9	established by law for regular congressional elections in years without a regularly
10	scheduled presidential election; to provide for the transition of current elected
11	officials to a new election schedule; to provide an exception for Orleans Parish; to
12	provide for submission of the proposed amendment to the electors; and to provide
13	for related matters.
14	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
15	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of
16	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to
17	amend Article III, Section 4(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:

1	§4. Qualifications; Residence and Domicile Requirements; Term; Election	
2	Limitations; Vacancies; Temporary Successors; Salary	
3	Section 4.	
4	* * *	
5	(C) Term and Election. (1) A member of the legislature shall be elected for	
6	a four-year term at the times established by law for regular congressional elections	
7	in years without a regularly scheduled presidential election.	
8	(2) Any member of the legislature who was elected to a term of office which	
9	began on January 8, 2024, shall hold office until the second Monday in January	
10	2031. The successors of these officials shall be elected to a regular term of office at	
11	the regular congressional elections held in 2030.	
12	* * *	
13	Section 2. Be it further resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the	
14	members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of	
15	the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a	
16	proposal to amend Article IV, Section 3(A) and (D) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read	
17	as follows:	
18	§3. Election; Term	
19	Section 3.(A) Election. Except as provided in Section 20 of this Article, the	
20	governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, treasurer,	
21	commissioner of agriculture, commissioner of insurance, superintendent of	
22	education, and commissioner of elections each shall be elected for a term of four	
23	years by the electors of the state at the time and place of voting for members of the	
24	legislature times established by law for regular congressional elections in years	
25	without a regularly scheduled presidential election. The term of each such official	
26	shall begin at noon on the second Monday in January next following the election.	
27	* * *	
28	(D)(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this constitution or of law to	
29	the contrary, statewide elected officials and members of the legislature elected in	

1	1987 shall hold office from and after the second Monday in March, 1988. These	
2	statewide elected officials and any successor elected to the unexpired term of any of	
3	them shall serve for terms which shall expire at noon on January 13, 1992. These	
4	members of the legislature and any successor elected to the unexpired term of any	
5	of them shall serve for terms which shall expire at ten o'clock a.m. on January 13,	
6	1992. Thereafter, statewide elected officials and members of the legislature shall be	
7	elected for terms of four years Statewide elected officials elected to a term of office	
8	which began on January 8, 2024, shall hold office until the second Monday in	
9	January 2031. The successors of these officials shall be elected to a regular term of	
10	office at the regular congressional elections held in 2030.	
11	(2) For purposes of retirement, the statewide elected officials and members	
12	of the legislature elected in 1987 shall be deemed to be elected for a four-year term.	
13	Section 4. Be it further resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the	
14	members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of	
15	the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a	
16	proposal to amend Article V, Sections 27, 28(A), and 29 of the Constitution of Louisiana,	
17	17 to read as follows:	
18	§27. Sheriffs	
19	Section 27. (A) In each parish a sheriff shall be elected for a term of four	
20	years at the times established by law for regular congressional elections in years	
21	without a regularly scheduled presidential election. He shall be the chief law	
22	enforcement officer in the parish, except as otherwise provided by this constitution,	
23	and shall execute court orders and process. He shall be the collector of state and	
24	parish ad valorem taxes and such other taxes and license fees as provided by law.	
25	(B) Any sheriff who was elected to a term of office which began on July 1,	
26	2024, shall hold office until June 30, 2031. The successors of these officials shall	
27	be elected to a regular term of office at the regular congressional elections held in	
28	<u>2030.</u>	
29	(C) This Section shall not apply to Orleans Parish.

1	§28. Clerks of Court
2	Section 28.(A) Powers and Duties; Election; Deputies. (1) In each parish
3	a clerk of the district court shall be elected for a term of four years. He shall be ex
4	officio notary public and parish recorder of conveyances, mortgages, and other acts
5	and shall have other duties and powers provided by law. The clerk may appoint
6	deputies with duties and powers provided by law and, with the approval of the
7	district judges, he may appoint minute clerks with duties and powers provided by
8	law.
9	(2) The clerk of court shall be elected at the time established by law for
10	regular congressional elections in years without a regularly scheduled presidential
11	election. Any clerk of court who was elected to a term of office which began on
12	July 1, 2024, shall hold office until June 30, 2031. The successors of these officials
13	shall be elected to a regular term of office at the regular congressional elections held
14	in 2030. This Subparagraph does not apply to Orleans Parish.
15	* * *
16	§29. Coroners
17	Section 29.(A) In each parish a coroner shall be elected for a term of four
18	years. He shall be a licensed physician and possess the other qualifications and
19	perform the duties provided by law. The requirement that he be a licensed physician
20	shall be inapplicable in any parish in which no licensed physician will accept the
21	office.
22	(B) The coroner shall be elected at the time established by law for regular
23	congressional elections in years without a regularly scheduled presidential election.
24	Any coroner who was elected to a term of office which began on March 25, 2024,
25	shall hold office until the Sunday before the fourth Monday in March 2031. The
26	successors of these officials shall be elected to a regular term of office at the regular
27	congressional elections held in 2030. This Paragraph does not apply to Orleans
28	Parish.

1	Section 5. Be it further resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the
2	members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of
3	the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a
4	proposal to amend Article VII, Section 24(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as
5	follows:
6	§24. Tax Assessors
7	Section 24.(A) Election; Term. (1) A tax assessor shall be elected by the
8	electors of each parish. His term of office shall be four years. His Except as
9	provided in this Section, his election, duties, and compensation shall be as provided
10	by law.
11	(2) The tax assessor shall be elected at the time established by law for
12	regular congressional elections in years without a regularly scheduled presidential
13	election. Any tax assessor who was elected to a term of office which began on
14	January 1, 2025, shall hold office until December 31, 2031. The successors of these
15	officials shall be elected to a regular term of office at the regular congressional
16	elections held in 2030.
17	* * *
18	Section 6. Be it further resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the
19	members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of
20	the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a
21	proposal to amend Article VIII, Section 3(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as
22	follows:
23	§3. State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education
24	* * *
25	(B)(1) Membership; Terms; Election. The board shall consist of eleven
26	members, eight of whom shall be elected from single-member districts, which shall
27	be determined as provided by law, and three of whom shall be appointed by the
28	governor from the state at large, with consent of the Senate. Members shall serve
29	terms of four years, which shall be concurrent with the term of the governor.

1	(2) Members shall be elected at the times established by law for regular
2	congressional elections in years without a regularly scheduled presidential election.
3	A member who was elected to a term of office which began on January 8, 2024, shall
4	hold office until the second Monday in January 2031. The successors of these
5	members shall be elected to a regular term of office at the regular congressional
6	elections held in 2030.
7	(3) No person who has served as a member of the board for more than two
8	and one-half terms in three consecutive terms shall be elected or appointed to the
9	board for the succeeding term. This Subparagraph shall not apply to any person
10	elected or appointed to the board prior to the effective date of this Subparagraph,
11	except that it shall apply to any term of service of any such person that begins after
12	such date.
13	* * *
14	Section 7. Be it further resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the
15	members elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of
16	the state of Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a
17	proposal to repeal Article VIII, Section 15 of the Constitution of Louisiana
18	Section 8. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
19	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on November 5,
20	2024.
21	Section 9. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election,
22	there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted
23	to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as
24	follows:
25	Do you support an amendment to require that state legislators, the governor,
26	other statewide elected officials, members of the State Board of Elementary
27	and Secondary Education, and sheriffs, clerks of court, coroners, and tax
28	assessors of parishes other than Orleans Parish be elected at regular
29	congressional elections in years without a regular presidential election?

HB 251 Original	2024 Regular Session	Green
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Abstract: Provides for election of state legislators, the governor, other statewide elected officials, members of the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education, sheriffs, clerks of court, coroners, and tax assessors at regularly scheduled congressional elections in years without a regularly scheduled presidential election. Extends the terms of current such elected officials to provide for the next election to be held in 2030.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that the governor, statewide elected officials, and members of the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) are elected at the same time as state legislators.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides that the governor, state legislators, statewide elected officials, members of BESE, sheriffs, clerks of court, coroners, and tax assessors shall be elected during the regularly scheduled congressional elections in years without a regularly scheduled presidential election.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> does not apply to elections for sheriff, clerk of court, coroner, or tax assessor in Orleans Parish.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides that state legislators, the governor, statewide elected officials, members of BESE, sheriffs, clerks of court, coroners, and tax assessors shall serve terms of four years. <u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> retains <u>present constitution</u>.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> extends the terms of legislators, statewide elected officials, and members of BESE of who were elected to a term of office which began on Jan. 8, 2024, until the second Monday in Jan. 2031.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> extends the terms of sheriffs and clerks of court who were elected to a term of office which began on July 1, 2024, until June 30, 2031.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> extends the terms of tax assessors who were elected to a term of office which began on Jan. 1, 2024, until Dec. 31, 2031.

<u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> provides for the next election to a regular term of office for all such elected officials to occur at the regular congressional elections held in 2030.

<u>Present constitution</u> provides for the transition of terms of elected and appointed members of BESE whose terms ended in 1980, 1982, and 1984. <u>Proposed constitutional amendment</u> repeals <u>present constitution</u>.

Provides for submission of the proposed amendment to the voters at the statewide election to be held Nov. 5, 2024.
