VOTERS/VOTING: Provides for eligibility to vote for certain offices beginning at age seventeen

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 18:101(A), 114(B)(1), 154(C)(1)(h), 425(B)(5), and 426(A)(4),
3	relative to elections; to provide relative to the eligibility to vote; to allow seventeen
4	year olds to vote in elections for state and local offices; to provide for certain records
5	of election officials relative thereto; to provide relative to the qualifications to be a
6	commissioner and alternate commissioner of certain persons at least seventeen years
7	of age; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 18:101(A), 114(B)(1), 154(C)(1)(h), 425(B)(5), and 426(A)(4) are
10	hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
11	§101. Registration to vote; qualifications; more than one residence; presidential
12	elections
13	A.(1) Every citizen of Louisiana who is at least eighteen seventeen years of
14	age or will attain that age on or before the next election, is an actual bona fide
15	resident of this state, and the parish, municipality, if any, and precinct in which he
16	offers to register as a voter, is not disfranchised, and who complies with the
17	provisions of this Chapter shall be eligible to register to vote in local, and state and
18	national elections held in this state. No one under the age of seventeen years shall
19	be permitted to vote in any state or local election.

1	(2) Any person age seventeen and who is otherwise qualified to vote may
2	register to vote at any time prior to the first election at which he shall have attained
3	the age of eighteen years. However, no one, No one under the age of eighteen years
4	shall be permitted to vote in any <u>national</u> election.
5	(3) A person who is sixteen years of age may register to vote in the manner
6	provided in R.S. 18:114(B)(1) or by making application in person at the office of the
7	registrar of voters. However, no one under the age of eighteen years shall be
8	permitted to vote in any election.

10	§114. Registration at driver's license facilities

12	B.(1) Each application to obtain, renew, or change the name or address on
13	a driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety and
14	Corrections made by an applicant who is eighteen seventeen years or older shall also
15	serve as an application for voter registration by the applicant unless the applicant
16	declines to register to vote through specific declination or by failing to sign the voter
17	registration application. Each application to obtain a driver's license issued by the
18	Department of Public Safety and Corrections made by an applicant who is sixteen
19	years old shall also serve as an application for voter registration by the applicant
20	unless the applicant declines to register to vote through specific declination or by
21	failing to sign the voter registration application. In addition, any person age
22	seventeen may register to vote at any time prior to the first election at which he shall
23	have attained the age of eighteen years. However, no one under the age of eighteen
24	years shall be permitted to vote in any election.

28	C.(1) Notwithstanding any provision of this Section to the contrary, the

1	registrar, the clerk of court, the Department of State, the office of motor vehicles of
2	the Department of Public Safety and Corrections and any entity that contracts with
3	the office, each voter registration agency and any entity that contracts with a voter
4	registration agency, and any person who handles the voter registration application
5	form of another person shall be prohibited from circulating on a commercial list or
6	otherwise disclosing the following:

15	(5) A person who is at least seventeen years of age, under the age of
16	eighteen, and is not a qualified registered voter but is otherwise qualified to serve as
17	a commissioner pursuant to this Subsection may be selected to serve as a
18	commissioner in any precinct of the ward where he may register to vote pursuant to
19	R.S. 18:101(A), provided that the person is enrolled in the twelfth grade of any
20	Louisiana public high school or state-approved nonpublic high school, is
21	participating at the twelfth grade level in a home study program approved by the
22	State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, has received a diploma from
23	any Louisiana public high school or state-approved nonpublic high school, has
24	received a diploma for completion of a home study program approved by the State
25	Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, or has been issued a high school
26	equivalency diploma after successfully completing the test of General Educational
27	Development.

1	§426. Alternate commissioners; qualifications, powers, and duties; oath and compensation
2	A. Qualifications.
3	* * *
4	(4) A person who is at least seventeen years of age, under the age of
5	eighteen, and is not a qualified registered voter but is otherwise qualified to serve as
6	an alternate commissioner pursuant to this Subsection may be selected to serve as an
7	alternate commissioner in any precinct of the ward where he may register to vote
8	pursuant to R.S. 18:101(A), provided that the person is enrolled in the twelfth grade
9	of any Louisiana public high school or state-approved nonpublic high school or is
10	participating at the twelfth grade level in a home study program approved by the
11	State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.
12	* * *
13	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
14	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
15	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
16	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
17	effective on the day following such approval.

HB 582 Original	2024 Regular Session
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Abstract: Provides that 17 year olds who are actual bona fide residents of this state and meet the requirements of the La. Election Code, may register and vote in state and local elections and makes related changes to the election code.

<u>Present constitution</u> guarantees every person who is both a citizen of the state and of the U.S., upon reaching 18 years of age, the right to register and vote, except that this right may be suspended for a person who is interdicted and judicially declared mentally incompetent or who is under an order of imprisonment for conviction of a felony.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 18:101) provides that every citizen of La. who is at least 18 years of age or will attain that age on or before the next election, is an actual bona fide resident of this state, and the parish, municipality, if any, and precinct in which he offers to register as a voter, is not disfranchised, and who complies with the provisions of <u>present law</u> in the La. Election Code shall be eligible to register to vote in local, state, and national elections held in this state. Further provides that any person age 17 and who is otherwise qualified to vote

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may register to vote at any time prior to the first election at which he shall have attained the age of 18 years. <u>Present law</u> further specifies that no one under the age of 18 years old shall be permitted to vote in any election.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides instead that every citizen of La. who is at least 17 years of age or will attain that age on or before the next election, is an actual bona fide resident of this state, and the parish, municipality, if any, and precinct in which he offers to register as a voter, is not disfranchised, and who complies with the provisions of <u>present law</u> in the La. Election Code shall be eligible to register to vote in local and state elections. Further limits the prohibition on persons under the age of 18 voting to national elections only and removes additional <u>present law</u> provisions specifying that no one under the age of 18 years old shall be permitted to vote in any election. Specifies that no one under the age of 17 shall be permitted to vote in any state or local election

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> provisions for citizens of the U.S. residing outside the U.S. who were domiciled in this state immediately prior to departure from the U.S. and who is at least 18 years of age or will attain that age on or before the next national election, and who is not disfranchised, shall be eligible to register absentee and vote absentee by mail if certain qualifications in the La. Election Code are met.

<u>Present law</u> relative to registration applications at driver's licenses facilities provides that each application to obtain, renew, or change the name or address on a driver's license or identification card issued by the Dept. of Public Safety & Corrections made by an applicant who is 18 years or older shall also serve as an application for voter registration by the applicant unless the applicant declines to register to vote or fails to sign the voter registration application.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the age from 18 years or older to 17 years or older, removes related provisions regarding 17 year olds registering to vote prior to the first election at which they will be 18 and specifying that no one under the age of 18 years old shall be permitted to vote in any election. Otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> protects certain records of election official from disclosure including the voter registration application and any information contained on the voter registration application of any person who is 16 or 17 years of age. <u>Proposed law</u> removes the voter registration applications of 17 year olds from the list of protected information.

<u>Present law</u> provides relative to the qualifications of commissioners and alternate commissioners and provides that a person who is at least 17 years of age, under the age of 18, and is not a qualified voter but is otherwise qualified to serve pursuant to <u>present law</u> may be selected to serve in any precinct of the ward where he may register to vote, provided that the person is enrolled in the 12th grade of any La. public high school or state-approved nonpublic high school, is participating at the12th grade level in a home study program approved by BESE, has received a diploma from any La. public high school or state-approved nonpublic high school, has received a diploma for completion of a home study program approved by BESE, or has been issued a high school equivalency diploma after successfully completing the test of General Educational Development.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the provision requiring the person to be under the age of 18 and not a qualified voter and provides instead that a person who is at least 17 but not a registered voter and who otherwise meets the requirements of <u>present law</u> is eligible to be a commissioner or alternate commissioner.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
