Current law provides for the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council. The council consists of 17 LA residents appointed by the governor. The council is tasked with monitoring and reporting (at least 30 days before regular session) to the governor and the legislature on the implementation and administration of workers' compensation. The advisory council makes recommendations to the governor, through the Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC), on any proposed rules affecting the administration or resolution of workers' compensation claims.

Proposed law repeals all revised statutes associated with the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council, effectively terminating the council.
