12	(a) No medication shall be administered to any student without an order from		
13	a licensed physician or dentist who is licensed to practice medicine or dentistry in		
14	the state of Louisiana or <del>an adjacent</del> any other state of the United States or any		
15	other authorized prescriber authorized in the state of Louisiana or any other state		
16	of the United States to prescribe medications or devices and a letter of request and		
17	authorization from the student's parent or guardian.

1 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 2 3 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 4 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 5 6 effective on the day following such approval.

Present law provides that no medication can be administered without an order from a licensed physician, dentist, or any other authorized prescriber and a letter of request and authorization from the student's parent or guardian.

Proposed law retains present law and further provides that no medication can be administered without an order from a licensed physician or dentist who is licensed to practice medicine or dentistry in the state of Louisiana or any other state of the United States or any other authorized prescriber authorized to prescribe in the state of Louisiana or any other state of the United States.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
