Increases the pay for jury duty

<u>Current law</u> provides that the daily compensation rate for jurors in criminal cases shall be \$25 for each day of jury service, and the mileage allowance shall not be less than 16 cents per mile nor more than the rate in effect for state officials; provides that except as provided by special law, jurors in civil cases who attend may demand and receive \$50 for each day of jury service and an amount equal to the rate in effect for state officials for each mile necessarily traveled in going to and returning from the courthouse. <u>Proposed law</u> increases the daily compensation rate for both jurors in criminal and civil cases to \$100 for each day of jury service.

## **EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION**

<u>Proposed law</u> will likely result in an indeterminable, yet significant, increase in Local Funds expenditures in judicial expense funds for criminal trials. <u>Proposed law</u> has the effect of doubling the daily compensation for jurors participating in civil trials and quadrupling the daily compensation for jurors participating in criminal trials. There will be no expenditure impact to state or local government for civil jurors, as the costs of convening juries in civil trials (including juror compensation) are borne by the parties that request a jury trial.

For <u>illustrative purposes</u>, for the past three years, there was an average of 443 criminal jury trials annually throughout the district courts. Assuming that in each of these jury trials, there was a total of 14 jurors impaneled (12 jurors and two alternates) over the course of two days, the cost incurred by the criminal courts would quadruple.

Estimated annual cost under <u>current law</u> 443 trials x \$25 daily compensation x 14 jurors x 2 days of trial = \$310,100

Estimated annual cost under proposed law 443 trials x \$100 daily compensation x 14 jurors x 2 days of trial = \$1,240,400

Increase in annual costs from <u>current law</u> to <u>proposed law</u> \$1,240,400 cost under proposed law - \$310,100 cost under current law = \$930,300
