SCHOOLS/EMPLOYEES: Requests the state Department of Education, Department of Children and Family Services, and Louisiana Department of Health to collaborate to increase mental health counseling in public schools

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the state Department of Education, the Department of Children and
Family Services, and the Louisiana Department of Health to collaborate to increase
mental health counseling in public schools.
WHEREAS, numerous studies have shown that children, adolescents, and teenagers
in the U.S. are suffering tremendously with mental health issues; in early 2023, the Centers
for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reported that, from 2011 to 2021, there were high
and worsening levels of persistent sadness or hopelessness across all racial and ethnic groups
of adolescents in the U.S.; and
WHEREAS, the CDC further reported that a combination of complex factors can
place young people at high risk for suicide, depression, substance use disorder, poor
academic performance, and other severe consequences; and
WHEREAS, according to the Louisiana Department of Health office of behavioral
health, the COVID-19 pandemic magnified the challenges facing adolescents' and children's
mental health, causing altered experiences at home, school, and during in-person social
interaction; the pandemic also highlighted the need for increased access to healthcare and
social services as an alarming number of young people struggle with feelings of
helplessness, depression, and thoughts of suicide; and
WHEREAS, expanding services available to public school students is one way to
help young people with the challenges they face today and the resulting mental health issues;
and

1 WHEREAS, the standard of care to be followed by mental health professionals 2 serving students in public schools should be the same as the ethical standards of licensed 3 mental health professionals; and 4 WHEREAS, parental engagement, involvement, and consent is essential in moving 5 forward with such efforts. 6 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby 7 urge and request the state Department of Education, the Department of Children and Family 8 Services, and the Louisiana Department of Health to collaborate to increase mental health 9 counseling in public schools. 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the departments shall submit a report to the 11 Legislature of Louisiana not later than February 1, 2025, that presents evidence of the 12 collaboration among the departments and of their efforts to identify and implement best 13 practices and a framework to increase mental health counseling in public schools. 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the 15 state superintendent of education, the secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, and the secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health. 16
