20	Congress in the Immigration and Nationality Act, in particular 8 U.S.C. 1158.
21	(b) Legally present in this state by virtue of authorization by the United
22	States Department of Homeland Security on the basis of any one of the
23	following:
24	(i) The person is a permanent legal resident.
25	<u>(ii) The person holds an unexpired student visa.</u>
26	<u>(iii) The person holds an unexpired work permit.</u>
27	(c) Legally present or entitled to be present in the United States pursuant
28	to an unexpired visitor or tourist visa, or pursuant to any other provision of
29	<u>federal law.</u>
30	(3) "Unlawfully enters into this state" means an alien who is found
31	entering or has entered into this state by automobile, watercraft, airplane, or
32	any other method of entry or means of conveyance, whether or not entry is
33	made directly from a foreign nation or indirectly from another state, without
34	lawful presence in this state."

27(d) "[S]tates are financially burdened by the cost of incarcerating illegal28aliens in their prison systems. Although the U.S. Department of Justice provides29limited funding to the states to offset some of these costs...reimbursements are30usually less than one percent of the total cost of incarcerating aliens, leaving the31states," including Louisiana, "to pay the balance."

(e) "Article I, Section 1 of the Louisiana Constitution declares that
 government is instituted by the people 'to protect the rights of the individual
 and for the good of the whole. Its only legitimate ends are to secure justice for
 all, preserve peace, protect the rights, and promote the happiness and general
 welfare of the people.''"
