HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 43

COURTS: Creates the Judicial Security Task Force

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To create and establish the Judicial Security Task Force to identify minimum requirements
3	for courthouse safety, to determine the minimum number of security officers that
4	should be present in each type of judicial proceeding in a circuit or district court, to
5	determine the minimum qualifications for security officers, to determine the
6	minimum standards for secure entry and exit of judicial officers from court facilities,
7	including minimum standards for secure parking and, if such parking is not
8	connected to the courthouse, secure transit between parking and the courthouse, to
9	determine the minimum standards for safe public areas of courthouses, including for
10	the protection of judicial officers who are required to enter public areas of the
11	courthouse in the performance of their duties, to identify physical security
12	deficiencies that currently exist in courthouses and develop a plan to address these
13	deficiencies, and to report its findings and recommendations to the House Committee
14	on Judiciary no later than February 1, 2025.
15	WHEREAS, protecting the safety and security of judicial officers throughout
16	Louisiana and the United States has become an issue of critical importance due to threats,
17	assaults, and murders of judicial officers and their family members; and
18	WHEREAS, there is a need to bolster efforts to protect the judiciary and safeguard

19 the personal information of judges and their immediate families; and

1	WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the Daniel Anderl Judicial Security
2	and Privacy Act in 2020, after an aggrieved litigant murdered the only son of U.S. District
3	Judge Esther Salas at her personal residence; and
4	WHEREAS, in recent years, an increasing number of judges have been threatened
5	for carrying out their critical work of administering justice; and
6	WHEREAS, personal information about judges and their families, including home
7	addresses, is easily found online; and
8	WHEREAS, it is imperative to find the appropriate balance between the safety of
9	judges and their families and the importance of transparency and accountability in the
10	judiciary.
11	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
12	acknowledge these increasing threats to judicial officers and seeks to ensure the protection,
13	safety, and security of judicial officers and their families and establish the Judicial Security
14	Task Force.
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall be composed of the
16	following members:
17	(1) The chief justice of the supreme court, or his designee.
18	(2) The chair of the Louisiana Conference of Court of Appeal Judges, or his
19	designee.
20	(3) The president of the Louisiana District Judges Association, or his designee.
21	(4) The president of the Louisiana Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges, or
22	his designee.
23	(5) The president of the Louisiana City Court Judges Association, or his designee.
24	(6) Three members of parish leadership, or their designees, from parishes with
25	varying density populations, appointed by the governor.
26	(7) One member of the Louisiana Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate.
27	(8) One member of the Louisiana House of Representatives, appointed by the
28	speaker of the House of Representatives.
29	(9) Three sheriffs, or their designees, from parishes with varying density
30	populations, appointed by the governor.

1	(10) The superintendent of Louisiana State Police, or his designee.
2	(11) Three chiefs of police, or their designees, from parishes with varying density
3	populations, appointed by the governor.
4	(12) A magistrate from a district court, appointed by the chief justice of the supreme
5	court.
6	(13) One clerk of a district court, appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court.
7	(14) One bailiff of a district court, appointed by the chief justice of the supreme
8	court.
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted
10	to the governor, the chief justice of the supreme court, the chair of the Louisiana Conference
11	of Court of Appeals Judges, the president of the Louisiana District Judges Association, the
12	president of the Louisiana Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges, the president of the
13	Louisiana City Court Judges Association, the superintendent of the Louisiana State Police,
14	the chairman of the House Committee on Judiciary, the president of the Senate, and the
15	speaker of the House of Representatives, and that the task force established pursuant to this
16	Resolution report its findings and recommendations to the legislature on or before February
17	1, 2025.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force established pursuant to this
19	Resolution shall submit one print copy and one electronic copy of any report produced
20	pursuant to this Resolution to the David R. Poynter Legislative Research Library as required

21 by R.S. 24:772.
