Abstract: Provides relative to the prohibition against the practice of medicine following the termination of employment or an independent contractor agreement.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits any contract, agreement, or provision that restricts a physician from the practice of medicine following the termination of any employment or independent contractor agreement.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that an enforceable contract, agreement, or a provision that restricts the practice of medicine shall be in effect only for the period that the physician is under the contract of employment or independent contractor agreement.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that "physician" means a natural person who is the holder of an allopathic (M.D.) degree or an osteopathic (D.O.) degree from a medical college in good standing with the board who holds a license, permit, certification, or registration issued by the board to engage in the practice of medicine in the state of Louisiana.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations</u> to the <u>original</u> bill:

- 1. Provide that an enforceable contract, agreement, or a provision that restricts the practice of medicine is only effective for the period that the physician is under the contract of employment or independent contractor agreement.
- 2. Make technical changes.
