Amendments proposed by House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice to Original House Bill No. 99 by Representative Bacala

## 1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

- 2 On page 1, line 2, after "To" and before the comma "," change "enact Code of Criminal
- 3 Procedure Article 313(E)" to "amend and reenact Code of Criminal Procedure Article
- 4 313(C)(1), (2), and (5)"

## 5 AMENDMENT NO. 2

- 6 On page 1, line 8, after "Article" and before "to" change "313(E) is hereby enacted" to
- 7 "313(C)(1), (2), and (5) are hereby amended and reenacted"

## 8 AMENDMENT NO. 3

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- 9 On page 1, delete lines 12 through 20 in their entirety and delete page 2 in its entirety and insert the following:
  - "C.(1)(a) When a person is arrested for a sex offense or a felony crime of violence, no bail shall be set until a magistrate has made a determination as to whether the contradictory bail hearing requirements of this Paragraph apply. Any magistrate with the authority to fix bail as provided in Article 314 may request that the law enforcement agency having custody of the defendant provide the magistrate with the criminal history of the defendant in order to determine whether the requirements of this Paragraph apply.
  - (b) A contradictory bail hearing, as provided for in this Paragraph, shall be held prior to setting bail for a person in custody who is charged with the commission of a sex offense and who has been previously convicted of a sex offense. meets any of the following criteria:
  - (i) The person is charged with the commission of a sex offense or felony crime of violence and has been previously convicted of a sex offense or felony crime of violence.
  - (ii) The person is charged with the commission of a sex offense or felony crime of violence and is currently released pursuant to a bail undertaking posted pursuant to Article 312 for a sex offense or felony crime of violence.
  - (2) The court, after having been given notice of an applicable prior conviction as described in Subparagraph (5) determining that the provisions of this Paragraph apply, shall order a contradictory hearing to be held within five days or as soon as practical under the circumstance after the receiving notice of the prior conviction determination, exclusive of weekends and legal holidays.
  - (5) For purposes of this Paragraph, "sex offense" means any offense as defined as a sex offense in R.S. 15:541 when the victim is under the age of thirteen at the time of commission of the offense and less than ten years have elapsed between the date of the commission of the current offense and the expiration of the maximum sentence of the previous conviction. "Felony crime of violence" shall mean any crime of violence enumerated or defined in R.S. 14:2(B) which is a felony.
