HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 14

SCHOOLS: Requests that the state Department of Education study the potential effects of alternative school calendar options on student academic achievement

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the state Department of Education to study the potential effects of
3	alternative school calendar options on student academic achievement and to submit
4	a written report of its findings and recommendations to the House Committee on
5	Education and the Senate Committee on Education not later than March 1, 2025.
6	WHEREAS, R.S. 17:154.1(C) requires each public school governing authority to
7	determine the school-year calendar for the schools under its jurisdiction and provides that
8	neither the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) nor the state
9	Department of Education (DOE) shall determine or require approval of these calendars; and
10	WHEREAS, current law sets minimum instructional minutes in a school day and
11	minimum days in a school year but allows some flexibility in how the time and days are
12	structured; and
13	WHEREAS, with this flexibility, school boards have various calendar options
14	available, including the balanced calendar model; and
15	WHEREAS, also known as year-round education, the balanced calendar model is a
16	concept that reorganizes minimum instructional time requirements across the academic year
17	to provide learning that is more continuous by reducing the time students spend on summer
18	vacation; and
19	WHEREAS, DOE has been conducting ongoing research on alternative school
20	calendar options, particularly the balanced calendar model, for the past several years; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the department bring its research up to date, inform
legislators of its findings and recommendations, and continue to assist public school
governing authorities in determining schedules that best meet the academic needs of their
students.
THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby
request that the state Department of Education study the potential effects of alternative
school calendar options on student academic achievement and to submit a written report of
its findings and recommendations to the House Committee on Education and the Senate
Committee on Education not later than March 1, 2025.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to
president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education and the state
superintendent of education.
