<u>Existing law</u> provides for the adoption of a policy by each public and nonpublic school governing authority authorizing a school to maintain a supply of naloxone or other opioid antagonists and authorizing school employees to administer them in an opioid emergency. <u>Prior law</u> authorized the adoption of this policy. <u>New law</u> requires its adoption.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that a school governing authority that did not adopt such a policy was not subject to civil liability for failing to authorize such supply or administration. <u>New law</u> provides a limitation of liability on schools, school employees, school volunteers, health professionals, and training organizations and their personnel.

<u>New law</u> further authorizes the administration of any life-saving medication at schools and applies the same limitation of liability. Requires the state Dept. of Education to develop and distribute a list of such medications. Authorizes training for administration to be provided by a medical emergency training organization, a registered nurse, or a licensed physician.

Effective August 1, 2024.
