<u>New law</u> requires that by Jan. 1, 2025, any trade school, community college, agency, public or private school, or person offering instruction in the operation of a commercial motor vehicle as part of a commercial motor vehicle driving course curriculum to include industry specific anti-trafficking training on the recognition, prevention, and reporting of human trafficking.

<u>New law</u> requires that beginning Aug. 1, 2024, the Bd. of Regents must establish industry specific anti-trafficking training materials for use in instruction on the recognition, prevention, and effective reporting of human trafficking by applicants as a requirement to obtain a Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license. <u>New law</u> authorizes the board to collaborate with organizations that specialize in and offer training materials on the recognition, prevention, and reporting of human trafficking for commercial truckers.

<u>New law</u> requires the board to review and update the training materials every three years to account for changes and trends in human trafficking.

Effective August 1, 2024.
