AN ACT

FISHING: Provides for the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 56:317(B)(1) and (2)(b) and (d) and (C), relative to the Louisiana
3	Catch and Cook Program; to allow charter boat captains to provide fish directly to
4	retail food establishments; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 56:317(B)(1) and (2)(b) and (d) and (C) are hereby amended and
7	reenacted to read as follows:
8	§317. Louisiana Catch and Cook Program; preparation of recreational fish or
9	alligator in retail food establishments
10	* * *
11	B.(1) The secretary of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries is hereby
12	authorized to establish, manage, and promote, in conjunction with the Louisiana
13	Charter Boat Association and the Louisiana Restaurant Association, the Louisiana
14	Catch and Cook Program, whereby a retail food establishment is authorized to
15	prepare any fish legally taken by a <u>licensed charter captain or a</u> licensed recreational
16	fisherman or any alligator legally taken by a licensed alligator hunter for
17	consumption by that charter boat captain, recreational fisherman, or alligator hunter
18	or any person in the charter boat captain's, fisherman's, or hunter's party.
19	(2) The program shall be established through the promulgation and adoption
20	of rules and regulations in conjunction with the Louisiana Department of Health and

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1 in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. Such rules and regulations 2 shall include but are not limited to the following which shall be enforced by Louisiana Department of Health, office of public health: 3 4 5 (b) The retail food establishment shall receive only fish or alligator meat, 6 within individual fishing limits, that has been cleaned, filleted, placed in clean, 7 food-grade, single-service packaging, <u>labeled</u>, and properly refrigerated. 8 9 (d) The fish or alligator shall be properly labeled with the date, and time the 10 fish or alligator are caught, and the full name and address of the licensed charter 11 captain, recreational fisherman, or alligator hunter. 12 C. Any retail food establishment or licensed charter captain that wishes to 13 14 participate in the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program shall apply to the Department 15 of Wildlife and Fisheries to be issued a participation permit by the department. 16 There shall be no an annual twenty dollar fee for the application process or permit 17 to be retained by the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program to be spent on the 18 promotion of the program. The permit may be suspended or revoked by the 19 department for any violation of the rules and regulations of this program. The 20 Department of Wildlife and Fisheries shall provide the name and location of each 21 participating retail food establishment and charter boat captain to the Louisiana 22 Department of Health, office of public health, upon request.

Abstract: Authorizes charter boat captains to provide fish directly to retail food establishments under the Louisiana Catch and Cook Program.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the secretary of the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries to establish the La. Catch and Cook Program to allow retail food establishments to prepare fish from

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licensed recreational fishermen or alligator from licensed alligator hunters or from anyone in their party.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds the management and promotion of the program of the dept. in conjunction with the La. Charter Boat Assoc. and La. Restaurant Assoc. and adds licensed charter captains or anyone in their party to the list of who can provide fish to restaurants.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that restaurants can only receive fish or alligator meat that has been cleaned, packaged, and refrigerated.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds that the fish or meat must be within fishing limits and must be labeled in addition to cleaned, packaged, and refrigerated.

Present law requires the labels include the date, time, and name of the fisherman or hunter.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds specificity regarding the date and time to include that it provide when the fish or alligator are caught and requires the address of the captain, fisherman, or hunter.

<u>Present law</u> specifies that no fee is required to participate in the program.

<u>Proposed law</u> modifies <u>present law</u> by adding a \$25 annual fee for participation to be spent on promotion of the program.
