Proposed law provides for a special statewide election to be held on Saturday, April 18, 2026, to submit proposed constitutional amendments passed during the 2025 Regular Session. Proposed law will be null and void if no proposed constitutional amendment specifies the statewide election on April 18, 2026. Proposed law provides that the election will be held in compliance with application provisions of the Louisiana Election Code (Title 18 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes).

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental expenditures as a result of this measure. Proposed law provides for a special statewide election on Saturday, April 18, 2026, for proposed constitutional amendments passed during the 2025 Regular Session. The April 18th election is currently scheduled as a Party Primary Election (statewide).

As a regular practice, the Secretary of State typically budgets for up to 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions for statewide elections. To the extent the ballot includes more than 10 constitutional amendments and statewide propositions, the Secretary of State may require additional SGF resources for the April 18, 2026, statewide election. Any expenditure impact would be realized in FY 26.
