ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL OR NO IMPACT See Note

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Provides relative to permitting for advanced nuclear power generation. (8/1/25) Present law authorizes the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to implement a program to expedite processing of

permits, modifications, registrations, or variances for environmental permit applicants. Proposed law adds that the secretary is to institute a federal permitting parity program for advanced nuclear power generation applications submitted by electric public utilities. Proposed law provides that the utility company submit that the application is for development and construction of a small modular reactor and is consistent with a letter of collaboration entered into between the applicant and the federal government.

The department has already established an expedited permitting process and anticipates being able to implement the proposed law with current staff and resources.
