SUPPLEMENTAL PAY

OR +\$64,800 GF EX See Note

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Provides supplemental pay for fire protection officers for the Lakefront Management Authority

Proposed legislation adds fire protection officers employed full-time by the Lakefront Management Authority to the list of eligible public employees that receive state supplemental pay. Proposed legislation provides \$600 per month in state supplemental pay for each full-time fire protection officer employed full-time by the Lakefront Management Authority who has completed one year of service, and any fire protection officer hired after March 31, 1986, shall also have completed and passed a certified fireman’s training program equal to National Fire Protection Association Standard 1001 Firefighter I and II Certification or a firemen's training program as approved by the Louisiana State University Firemen Training Program and an airport rescue and firefighting certification.

A companion bill (HB 349) provides for a constitutional amendment to be placed on the ballot for an upcoming statewide election.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed legislation will increase state expenditures by a maximum of \$64,800 SGF as a result of adding fire protection officers employed full-time by Lakefront Management Authority to the list of public employees that receive state supplemental pay. Each eligible fire protection officer would receive \$600 per month or \$7,200 annually (\$600 per month x 12 months). In FY 26, there are 9 full-time fire protection officers employed by Lakefront Management Authority. Under the proposed legislation, if all 9 fire protection officers are eligible to receive supplemental pay, the cost would be \$64,800 annually (9 officers x \$7,200).

Proposed law will increase Local Funds expenditures by an indeterminable amount as state supplemental payments are included in the pensionable earnings used in the calculation of retirement benefits.

Note: The constitutional amendment is in companion bill HB 349. If HB 349 is enacted into law, the constitutional amendment allowing fire protection officers employed by an airport authority to be eligible for state supplemental pay will appear on the official ballot in a statewide election.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

There is no anticipated direct material effect on governmental revenues as a result of this measure.
