16	WHEREAS, a dedicated advocate for the welfare of children, Gay and her husband
17	founded the St. Elizabeth Foundation in 1988, a nonprofit adoption agency that has placed
18	more than six hundred babies into loving homes, offering unwavering support to pregnant
