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Provides relative to screening pregnant women for HIV and syphilis. (gov sig)

<u>Present law</u> requires a physician that attends a pregnant woman for conditions relating to pregnancy to offer to take a blood sample to test for HIV and syphilis at her first examination, during her third trimester, and during labor and delivery. <u>Present law</u> requires a physician to take a blood sample if the woman doesn't object. <u>Present law</u> provides for when a blood sample is not required for testing.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires every licensed physician who provides prenatal care to pregnant women to order a blood sample for testing at the first prenatal care visit, the woman's first prenatal visit during the third trimester or as soon as possible thereafter, and at the time of labor and delivery. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that consent is implied unless the woman declines the testing.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

<u>Proposed law</u> may increase expenditures by an indeterminable amount in the Louisiana Department of Health (LDH), Medicaid program, associated with reimbursement for additional HIV and syphilis tests. <u>Proposed law</u> updates requirements for HIV and syphilis testing for pregnant women by removing the requirement for a physician to "offer to take a blood sample" and adding that consent is implied unless the woman declines testing.
