SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 67

COMMENDATIONS. Commends Xavier University of Louisiana for 100 years of excellence, innovation, and transformative education.

1 A RESOLUTION

2 To commend Xavier University of Louisiana on the occasion of its centennial anniversary
3 and to recognize the university's extraordinary contributions to higher education, the
4 African American community, and the state of Louisiana over the past one hundred
5 years.

6 WHEREAS, Xavier University of Louisiana, the nation's only historically Black and
7 Catholic university, is celebrating its centennial anniversary in 2025, marking one hundred
8 years of educational excellence, social justice advocacy, and cultural enrichment; and

9 WHEREAS, Xavier University was founded in 1925 by Saint Katharine Drexel and
10 the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament with a mission to provide quality education rooted in
11 faith, service, and social justice, challenging systemic racism and expanding opportunities
12 for underrepresented communities; and

13 WHEREAS, despite formidable challenges in its initial years, Xavier emerged as a
14 beacon of academic excellence, becoming a leading producer of African American doctors,
15 pharmacists, and STEM graduates, and recently achieving Research Colleges and
16 Universities (RCU) status in the Carnegie classifications; and

17 WHEREAS, President Emeritus Dr. Norman C. Francis, a 1952 Xavier alumnus,
18 served as president for forty-seven transformative years, expanding enrollment, academic

1 programs, and the campus footprint while establishing Xavier as a national leader in
2 preparing Black students for medical and graduate education; and

3 WHEREAS, current President, Dr. C. Reynold Verret, continues to uphold and
4 advance Xavier's mission, integrating innovative programs in liberal arts, data science,
5 bioinformatics, crime and social justice, and jazz studies, while maintaining a focus on faith,
6 excellence, and service; and

7 WHEREAS, Xavier's unique culture of peer support, mentorship, and academic
8 collaboration fosters not just scholars, but compassionate, engaged citizens dedicated to
9 creating a more just and humane society; and

10 WHEREAS, Xavier's rigorous core curriculum and hands-on educational experiences
11 prepare students to become critical thinkers, global leaders, and life-long learners, with more
12 than thirty percent of its students advancing to graduate or professional schools; and

13 WHEREAS, from its humble beginnings as a high school and Normal School in
14 1915, to the establishment of its permanent campus in 1933, through rebuilding after
15 Hurricane Katrina, to its current role as a national educational leader, Xavier University's
16 resilience and commitment have remained unwavering; and

17 WHEREAS, the yearlong 100th-anniversary celebration provides an opportunity for
18 the Xavier community, alumni, and the state of Louisiana to reflect on a century of
19 achievement and to look forward to a future of continued excellence and impact.

20 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
21 does hereby commend Xavier University of Louisiana on the celebration of its centennial
22 anniversary, recognize its distinguished history and invaluable contributions to education
23 and social justice, and express best wishes for continued success in the century ahead.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to Dr.
25 C. Reynold Verret, President of Xavier University of Louisiana.
