SPECIAL DAY/WEEK/MONTH. Designates Wednesday, April 30, 2025, as Louisiana Chemical Industry Day at the Louisiana State Capitol and recognizes the vital role the chemical manufacturing sector plays in the state's economy, innovation, and community development.

2	To designate Wednesday, April 30, 2025, as Louisiana Chemical Industry Day at the
3	Louisiana State Capitol and to recognize the vital role the chemical manufacturing
4	sector plays in the state's economy, innovation, and community development.
5	WHEREAS, nature has endowed Louisiana with strategic natural resources,
6	including abundant oil and natural gas, salt dome caverns, sulfur deposits, fresh water, and
7	critical access to global trade routes via the Calcasieu Basin and Mississippi River, forming
8	a strong foundation for industrial growth; and
9	WHEREAS, the petrochemical and chemical manufacturing industry that has
10	developed around these resources is one of Louisiana's most vital and enduring economic
11	assets; and
12	WHEREAS, the Louisiana chemical industry directly employs over 34,300 workers
13	and supports an additional 79,000 jobs through supplier networks, logistics, and other related
14	sectors, making it one of the largest drivers of employment in the state's manufacturing
15	economy; and
16	WHEREAS, the industry provides approximately \$3.7 billion in annual wages, with
17	compensation levels that are, on average, 50% higher than typical manufacturing wages in
18	the state, reflecting the industry's need for skilled and highly trained workers; and

1	WHEREAS, Louisiana's chemical manufacturers produce more than \$65 billion in
2	products annually, making the state the second-largest producer of chemical products in the
3	United States, and export more than \$13.2 billion in chemical products to global markets
4	each year; and
5	WHEREAS, the chemical industry contributes more than \$2 billion in annual tax
6	payments to state and local governments, supporting essential public services and
7	infrastructure, with further economic impact generated through indirect activity and
8	consumer spending; and
9	WHEREAS, major capital investments continue to expand Louisiana's chemical
10	production capabilities, creating new permanent jobs and generating thousands of additional
11	construction and support roles during development of these investments; and
12	WHEREAS, Louisiana's chemical industry is investing in next-generation
13	technologies such as carbon capture and sequestration, strengthening the state's position as
14	a global leader in advanced manufacturing and ensuring the industry remains competitive
15	for decades to come; and
16	WHEREAS, these innovations support long-term capital investment, create
17	high-wage jobs, and help attract continued domestic and international investment in
18	Louisiana's industrial corridors, enhancing the state's reputation as a forward-looking hub
19	for chemical production; and
20	WHEREAS, the industry participates in safety and environmental excellence
21	programs, demonstrating a commitment to responsible operations and continuous
22	improvement in health, safety, and environmental outcomes; and
23	WHEREAS, chemical manufacturers in Louisiana collaborate with community
24	colleges, technical programs, and universities to strengthen STEM education and skilled
25	trades training, sponsoring youth development programs and creating clear pathways to
26	long-term careers for Louisiana residents; and
27	WHEREAS, the industry is actively engaged in community safety, partnering with
28	local officials and emergency responders to develop preparedness protocols, conduct drills,
29	and implement early warning systems to ensure public well-being; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Chemical Association, founded in 1959, represents
