Present law (R.S. 33:1221) provides that police jurors shall serve four year terms.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but provides that no person who has been elected to serve as a police juror in DeSoto Parish for more than two and one-half terms in three consecutive terms shall be eligible to be a police juror for the succeeding term.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the limit on the number of terms a member of the police jury in DeSoto Parish may serve shall be subject to approval of a majority of the electors voting at an election held on November 3, 2026.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>proposed law</u> shall have prospective application only and shall not apply to police jurors elected prior to the effective date of <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective August 1, 2025.
