### SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

- 1. Make technical changes.
- 2. Restructure the definition of "critical infrastructure".
- 3. Add equipment and communication wires that are connected to certain facilities to the definition of "critical infrastructure".

## DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

SB 22 Engrossed

<u>Present law</u> provides for the crime of unauthorized entry of a critical infrastructure and defines "critical infrastructure" for purpose of the present law.

<u>Proposed law</u> adds equipment and communication wires that are connected to certain facilities to the present law definition of "critical infrastructure".

<u>Proposed law</u> creates the crime of theft of critical infrastructure and makes it a crime to misappropriate, take, or illegally possess any critical infrastructure belonging to another with the intent to permanently deprive the owner of whatever was taken.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides definitions relative to <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a person convicted of theft of critical infrastructure when the misappropriation, taking, or illegal possession amounts to a value of less than \$25,000 shall be fined not more than \$10,000, or imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not more than 15 years, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a person convicted of theft of critical infrastructure when the misappropriation, taking, or illegal possession amounts to a value of \$25,000 or more shall be fined not more than \$50,000, or imprisoned at hard labor for not more than 20 years, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a person convicted of theft of critical infrastructure wherein it is foreseeable that human life will be threatened as a result of the theft shall be fined not more than \$50,000, or imprisoned at hard labor for not more than 20 years, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a person convicted of theft of critical infrastructure, in addition to other <u>proposed law</u> penalties, shall be ordered to make full restitution to the victim in accordance with present law.

Effective Aug. 1, 2025.
