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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 61

BY REPRESENTATIVE COATES

WATER/RESOURCES: Creates a special task force to study the interagency consultation process for data centers to ensure more complete natural resource planning and management

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To create and provide with respect to a special task force to study and make
3	recommendations with respect to an Interagency Consultation process for current and
4	future data centers and data processing centers to ensure more complete natural
5	resource planning and active management.
6	WHEREAS, the United States Department of Energy found that data center energy
7	use tripled between 2014 and 2023 and is projected to continue to grow, with estimates that
8	it could consume six to twelve percent of total United States electricity demand by 2028; and
9	WHEREAS, in addition to energy demand, data centers use a significant amount of
10	water for cooling processes and electricity generation, with larger data centers using between
11	one to five million gallons per day; and
12	WHEREAS, the number of data centers is projected to grow, with several planned and
13	proposed in Louisiana, and more data centers possible in the future; and
14	WHEREAS, the Louisiana Legislature has enacted laws to protect, conserve, and
15	replenish the natural resources of the state to fulfill Article IX, Section 1 of the Constitution
16	of Louisiana; and
17	WHEREAS, although Louisiana has been defined historically by an abundance of
18	water resources, it has experienced record drought conditions in recent years, impacting both
19	ground and surface water resources, which are already being utilized by agricultural,
20	industrial, and manufacturing sectors; and

1	WHEREAS, the risk of potential water and energy impacts from data cer	nters only
2	being addressed at the permitting phase could cause adverse impacts to water ar	nd energy
3	sources that may also affect existing businesses and land uses; and	
4	WHEREAS, the state does not have a process for analyzing indivi	dual and
5	sector-wide water resource impacts, and the state legislature has historically e	expressed
6	support for developing a statewide water policy; and	
7	WHEREAS, in order to secure the longevity and sustainability of Louisiana	ı's natural
8	resources, it should consider a more proactive approach to planning and oversight the	nat would
9	be beneficial for economic prospects and the public interest by reducing the pot	ential for
10	future conflict and competition for resources; and	
11	WHEREAS, providing for an interagency consultation process to assess the	ne energy
12	and water impacts of planned and proposed data centers would utilize the expertis	e of state
13	agencies to help ensure protection of resources and predictability of planning.	
14	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana doe	es hereby
15	create a special task force to be named the Interagency Data Center Consulta	ation and
16	Assessment Group, referred to as the "Interagency Group", composed of me	mbers as
17	provided herein, to study and make recommendations regarding the growth of data of	enter and
18	related operations, including decommissioning.	
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Interagency Group shall be composed	sed of the
20	following members:	
21	(1) The chairman of the House Committee on Natural Resour	rces and
22	Environment, or his designee.	
23	(2) The chairman of the Senate Committee on Natural Resources, or his	designee.
24	(3) The secretary of the Department of Energy and Natural Resource	es, or his
25	designee.	
26	(4) The chairman of the Public Service Commission, or his designee.	
27	(5) The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheri	es, or his
28	designee.	
29	(6) The commissioner of the Department of Agriculture and Foresti	ry, or his
30	designee.	

1 **(7)** The secretary of the Department of Environmental Quality, or her designee. 2 (8) A member of the Water Resources Commission appointed by the secretary of 3 the Department of Energy and Natural Resources. 4 (9) The president of the Public Affairs Research Council, or his designee. 5 One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the chairman of (10)6 the House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment. 7 (11)One member of the Senate appointed by the chairman of the Senate Committee 8 on Natural Resources. 9 Any additional members as the chairman of the Interagency Group deems (12)10 necessary. 11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Interagency Data Center Consultation and 12 Assessment Group shall be chaired by the designee of the chairmen of the House Committee 13 on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on Natural Resources, and 14 the group shall report to and be staffed by the Department of Energy and Natural Resources. 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Interagency Group shall: 16 (1) Investigate long-term energy and water consumption demand for or by 17 approved and potentially proposed projects. 18 (2) Identify a process in which the Interagency Group can review data center 19 proposals with meaningful opportunity to assess impacts. 20 (3) Identify options the state can consider to implement long-term water resource 21 and energy planning into project approvals. 22 **(4)** Identify pathways to resolve potential conflicts between water users, especially in times of water shortages. 23 24 (5) Hold public meetings on findings and proposals. 25 Produce assessment reports for each planned or proposed data center detailing (6) 26 the above measures. 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the special task force shall report its findings to 28 the legislature no later than February 27, 2026.
