1	A JOINT RESOLUTION
2	Proposing to amend Article V, Section 23(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to the
3	mandatory retirement of judges; to provide that a judge shall not remain in office
4	beyond his seventy-fifth birthday; to provide for submission of the proposed
5	amendment to the electors; and to provide for related matters.
6	Section 1. Be it resolved by the Legislature of Louisiana, two-thirds of the members
7	elected to each house concurring, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the state of
8	Louisiana, for their approval or rejection in the manner provided by law, a proposal to
9	amend Article V, Section 23(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, to read as follows:
10	§23. Judges; Retirement
11	Section 23.
12	* * *
13	(B) Mandatory Retirement. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, a
14	judge shall not remain in office beyond his seventieth birthday seventy-fifth
15	birthday. A judge who attains seventy-five years of age A judge who attains seventy
16	years of age while serving a term of office shall be allowed to complete that term of
17	office.
18	Section 2. Be it further resolved that this proposed amendment shall be submitted
19	to the electors of the state of Louisiana at the statewide election to be held on April 18, 2026.

Section 3. Be it further resolved that on the official ballot to be used at the election, there shall be printed a proposition, upon which the electors of the state shall be permitted to vote YES or NO, to amend the Constitution of Louisiana, which proposition shall read as follows:

Do you support an amendment to change the mandatory retirement age for judges from seventy to seventy-five, provided that a judge may continue to serve to complete a term of office? (Amends Article V, Section 23(B))
