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HB 722 Reengrossed

2026 Regular Session

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Abstract: Provides for automatic reinstatement of suspended, cancelled, and revoked driver's licenses upon full payment of department fees and proof of payment of traffic fines.

Present law (R.S. 32:414(F)(2)) authorizes the Dept. of Public Safety and Corrections (DPS&C), office of motor vehicles (OMV), to suspend, cancel, or revoke driver's licenses for cause satisfactory to the dept. for a period of not more than one year.

Proposed law retains present law and requires that any license suspended, cancelled, or revoked for nonpayment of fees be automatically reinstated if both of the following occur:

- (1) The person makes full payment of all fees and fines assessed by the DPS&C, OMV, that resulted in the suspension, cancellation, and revocation of the license.
- (2) The person provides proof of payment of any fees or fines pursuant to the requirements of present law.

Further provides for an exception that proposed law not apply to a person whose driver's license suspended, cancelled, or revoked for operating a vehicle while impaired.

Present law (R.S. 32:415(B)(1)(a)) requires any period of suspension or revocation be automatically extended for a period of one year from the date the licensee would otherwise have been entitled to apply for a new license upon his conviction for any offense involving the operation of a motor vehicle committed during such period. Further requires that no driver can use a license issued to him in another state or the privilege of a nonresident to drive a vehicle in this state, upon receiving notice of his conviction, or of the entry of a plea of guilty and sentence, or of the forfeiture of bail in another state of federal jurisdiction for any offense, which if committed in this state, would be grounds for suspension or revocation of the license.

Proposed law retains present law and requires that any license suspended, cancelled, or revoked for nonpayment of fees for operating a vehicle while a license is suspended be automatically reinstated if both of the following occur:

- (1) The person makes full payment of all fees and fines assessed by the DPS&C, OMV, that resulted in the suspension, cancellation, and revocation of the license.
- (2) The person provides proof of payment of any fees or fines pursuant to the requirements of

present law.

Further provides for an exception that proposed law not apply to a person whose driver's license suspended, cancelled, or revoked for operating a vehicle while impaired.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Transportation, Highways and Public Works to the original bill:

1. Make technical changes.
2. Add an exception that suspended, revoked, and cancelled licenses cannot be automatically reinstated for offenses pursuant to the crime of operating a vehicle while impaired. Further requires a second violation pursuant to present law (R.S. 14:98) include an additional one year suspension of the person's driver's license.
3. Add the requirement that a person's driver's license be automatically reinstated upon full payment of all fees assessed by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, and proof of payment of any fines associated with unpaid traffic and parking fines, or any other provision in present law (R.S. 32:393), that resulted in the suspension, cancellation, or revocation of a driver's license, except for offenses pursuant to the crime of operating a vehicle while impaired. Further requires a second violation pursuant to present law (R.S. 14:98) include an additional one year suspension of the person's driver's license.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

1. Remove proposed law that created a requirement that upon a second violation of operating a vehicle while impaired, an additional one year suspension will be added.
2. Clarify the requirements to automatically reinstate suspended, cancelled, or revoked driver's licenses for nonpayment of fees assessed by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, if the person makes full payment of all fees and fines and provides proof of payment.
3. Clarify the requirements to automatically reinstate suspended, cancelled, or revoked driver's licenses for nonpayment of fees for operating a vehicle while a license is suspended if the person makes full payment of all fees and fines and provides proof of payment.
