Amendments proposed by Senate Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations to Reengrossed House Bill No. 680 by Representative Wyble

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 3, after "to enact R.S. 23:2062(5) and (6)" delete the remainder of the line
3 and insert "and R.S. 23:2065.1, and to"

4 AMENDMENT NO. 2

5 On page 1, line 8, after "Workforce Investment Council;" insert "to require an annual parish-
6 level workforce outcomes report to the legislature;"

7 AMENDMENT NO. 3

8 On page 1, line 15, after "and (6)" insert "and 2065.1"

9 AMENDMENT NO. 4

10 On page 8, between lines 9 and 10, insert:

11 "§2065.1. Annual workforce outcomes report; disaggregation by parish

12 A. No later than February fifteenth of each year, Louisiana Works, in
13 coordination with the Workforce Investment Council, shall prepare and submit a
14 comprehensive Annual Workforce Outcomes Report to the governor, the president
15 of the Senate, the speaker of the House of Representatives, the Senate Committee on
16 Labor and Industrial Relations, the House Committee on Labor and Industrial
17 Relations, the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, and the legislative auditor.
18 The first report required by this Section shall be submitted no later than February 15,
19 2027, and shall cover fiscal year 2025-2026.

20 B. The report shall include, at a minimum, all of the following data, reported
21 both statewide and disaggregated by parish of the participant's residence at the time
22 of program entry:

23 (1) The number of individuals who received workforce development services
24 funded in whole or in part with state or federal workforce funds, reported separately
25 for adults, dislocated workers, and youth.

26 (2) The number and percentage of program participants in unsubsidized
27 employment during the second and fourth quarters after program exit.

28 (3) Median earnings of program participants during the second quarter after
29 program exit.

30 (4) The number and percentage of participants who obtained a recognized
31 postsecondary credential, industry-recognized certification, or secondary school
32 diploma, or its recognized equivalent, during participation or within one year after
33 program exit.

34 (5) Measurable skill gains achieved by participants in education or training
35 programs leading to a recognized credential or employment.

36 (6) The effectiveness of services to employers, including employer
37 penetration rate, repeat employer engagement rate, and the number of work-based
38 learning opportunities created, including apprenticeships, on-the-job training,
39 internships, and incumbent worker training.

40 (7) Total state and federal workforce development funds expended,
41 categorized by direct training, direct participant services, employer-focused
42 activities, supportive services, and administration.

43 (8) Cost per participant and cost per credential attained.
