
HOUSE COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS

2026 Regular Session

Substitute for Original House Bill No. 1163 by Representative Chance Henry as proposed by the House Committee on Commerce

This document reflects the content of a substitute bill but is not in a bill form; page numbers in this document DO NOT correspond to page numbers in the substitute bill itself.

To amend and reenact R.S. 51:650(23), (24), (26), and (28), 651.1(B), 652(B), 655(C)(3) and (8), (E), (G), and (H)(1), and 656(C)(1)(f) and (E), to enact R.S. 51:656(F), and to repeal R.S. 51:650(6) and (27) and 655(D), relative to fireworks; to provide for definitions; to classify which items may be sold to the public; to provide for a time period for selling; to provide for licensing and permitting requirements; to provide for fees; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 51:650(23), (24), (26), and (28), 651.1(B), 652(B), 655(C)(3) and (8), (E), (G), and (H)(1), and 656(C)(1)(f) and (E) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 51:656(F) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§650. Definitions

As used in this Part, the following terms have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(23) "Proximate display" includes ~~all indoor displays and means a pyrotechnic public display involving the ignition of Fireworks 1.3G or Fireworks 1.4G for public viewing, where the audience is closer to the pyrotechnic devices than permitted by NFPA 1123 Code of Fireworks Display. The term does not include the use of Fireworks 1.4G by a retail consumer for private or personal viewing any indoor display or a pyrotechnic public display for public viewing where the audience is closer to the pyrotechnic devices than permitted by NFPA 1123 and governed by NFPA 1126 and NFPA 1124.~~ any indoor display or a pyrotechnic public display for public viewing where the audience is closer to the pyrotechnic devices than permitted by NFPA 1123 and governed by NFPA 1126 and NFPA 1124.

(24) "Public display" means the ~~display of 1.4S, 1.4G, or 1.3G fireworks, including fireworks not listed as permissible in R.S. 51:651, used for any purpose~~

relating to the amusement of the general public use of 1.4S, 1.4G, or 1.3G fireworks for the public's amusement, governed by NFPA 1123 and NFPA 1124 requirements, as published by the National Fire Protection Association, or NFPA, or any subsequent amended additions thereof. "Public display" does not include a retail consumer's use of 1.4G fireworks for private viewing.

(26) "Pyrotechnic operator" means an individual ~~who, by experience and examination, has demonstrated the necessary skill and ability for safely assembling, discharging, and supervising public displays of Fireworks 1.3G~~ skilled through experience and examination and licensed by the office of state fire marshal to safely assemble, discharge, and supervise public displays of 1.3G or 1.4G fireworks.

(28) "Pyrotechnic special effects operator" means an individual ~~who, by experience and examination, has demonstrated the necessary skill and ability for safely assembling, discharging, and supervising proximate displays of Fireworks 1.3G, 1.4G, and 1.4S~~ skilled through experience and examination and licensed by the office of state fire marshal to safely assemble, discharge, and supervise proximate displays of 1.3G or 1.4G fireworks.

§651.1. Possession, sale, or use of certain fireworks prohibited; penalties

* * *

B. ~~It is unlawful for any person in the state of Louisiana to possess, sell, or use for any purpose whatsoever any of the following items of commercial fireworks: cherry bombs, tubular salutes, two-inch American-made salutes, firecrackers with casings the external dimensions of which exceed one and one-half inches in length or one-quarter of an inch in diameter, repeating bombs, aerial bombs, torpedoes which exceed three-eighths of an inch in diameter, Roman candles larger than ten ball, and sky rockets larger than six ounces. It is also unlawful for any person to ship into the state of Louisiana any of the above mentioned items for any purpose whatsoever. Only items classified as 1.4G fireworks in compliance with American~~

Pyrotechnics Association, or APA, Standard 87-1A may be sold by a properly licensed retailer to the public.

§652. Proper naming; certification on shipping cases; time for selling; exceptions; sale and storage in homes prohibited

B. Permissible items of fireworks, enumerated in R.S. 51:651, may be sold at retail only from ~~noon~~ seven o'clock in the morning June sixteenth through midnight July fifth; ~~and noon~~ seven o'clock in the morning December fifteenth through midnight January first; seven o'clock in the morning on the Thursday immediately prior to Ash Wednesday through midnight on Ash Wednesday; seven o'clock in the morning on the Tuesday immediately prior to Memorial Day through midnight on Memorial Day; and seven o'clock in the morning on the Tuesday immediately prior to Labor Day through midnight on Labor Day of each calendar year.

§655. Public displays; proximate displays; ~~Class C public displays~~; licenses; permits; fees; adoption of rules and regulations

(3) A licensee whose license has been expired for two years or more and who makes application for a new license shall retake and pass the written examination to receive a ~~renewed~~ new license.

(8) The cost of the pyrotechnic operator, pyrotechnic special effects operator, and blaster's license is ~~fifty~~ two hundred dollars for a new license and ~~twenty-five~~ one hundred dollars for renewals.

~~E.(1) A person or firm shall not make or perform a public display, proximate display, or Class C public display, as defined in this Part, without first obtaining a permit from the office of state fire marshal.~~

(2)(1) A person or firm ~~desiring~~ applying for a permit for a public display or proximate display may either apply to the office of state fire marshal or to a certified local authority certified under in accordance with the provisions of R.S. 40:1563, which application shall be received by either the state fire marshal or the certified local authority at least five days prior to the event. The application shall contain all of the following information:

(a) The date, time, and place of the public display or proximate display including the length of time of the display.

(b) All fire prevention plans and provisions that will be in force and all fire prevention personnel and equipment available to ensure the safety of the public attending the display.

(c) A copy of the permit issued by the office of state fire marshal to the distributor who will be supplying or conducting the public display or proximate display to assure the state fire marshal or his certified local authority that the fireworks and the actual presentation and conduct of the public display or proximate display will not endanger the public safety.

(d) A current certificate of insurance issued to the office of state fire marshal showing general liability coverage in the amount of one million dollars.

~~(3) A public entity desiring a permit for a Class C public display may apply to the office of state fire marshal, which application shall be received by the state fire marshal at least five days prior to the event. The application shall contain the following information:~~

~~(a) The date, time, and place of the Class C public display including the length of time of the display.~~

~~(b) All plans and provisions that will be in force to ensure the safety of the public attending the public display.~~

~~(c) A copy of the training certification issued by the office of state fire marshal to the person or firm who will be conducting the Class C public display to assure the state fire marshal that the fireworks and the actual presentation and conduct of the Class C public display will not endanger the public safety.~~

~~(4)(2) The fee for application for a permit for a public display or proximate display is one two hundred dollars. The fee for renewal of such permit shall be one hundred dollars. All fees and shall be used to offset the cost of processing the permit request and cover the expense of any necessary onsite inspections. ~~The fee for the application for a permit for a Class C public display is twenty-five dollars and shall be used to offset the cost of processing the permit request and any necessary onsite inspections.~~~~

G. The state fire marshal may promulgate and adopt rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to ensure that the supplier of the fireworks and the holder of a public display, proximate display, ~~or Class C public display~~ permit will adequately protect the public safety.

H.(1) Fireworks that are to be used for public display or proximate display ~~only~~ shall at all times be kept in the possession of those responsible and be stored in an appropriate storage in accordance with the regulations of NFPA 1124 as published by the National Fire Protection Association, or any subsequent amended editions thereof that are adopted by the state fire marshal. Fireworks that are to be used for public display shall be confined to that use only.

§656. Permit to sell fireworks; application; fees; permit numbers

C.(1) The applicant shall pay a permit fee for each type of business conducted and for each location at which the business is conducted, according to the following schedule:

- (a) Manufacturer \$ 10,000.00
- (b) Assembler \$ 1,000.00

(c) Distributor	\$ 2,000.00
(d) Importer	\$ 500.00
(e) Jobber	\$ 250.00
(f) Retailer	\$ 100.00 <u>250.00</u>

E. It is unlawful for any person to purchase fireworks from a distributor without first obtaining a valid retail permit issued by the state fire marshal.

F. It is unlawful for a jobber or retailer who holds a permit issued pursuant to the provisions of this Part to purchase fireworks from a distributor domiciled outside the state of Louisiana unless that distributor can show proof that he holds a valid permit issued as provided in this Part to perform the functions of a distributor and importer. If the distributor does not hold a valid permit, the jobber or retailer is then liable for the permit and shall immediately purchase a permit from the office of state fire marshal.

Section 2. R.S. 51:650(6) and (27) and 655(D) are hereby repealed in their entirety.

HB Draft 2026 Regular Session

Abstract: Provides relative to fireworks.

Present law provides for definitions.

Proposed law amends definitions of "proximate display", "public display", "pyrotechnic operator", and "pyrotechnic special effects operator" and repeals definitions of "Class C public display" and "pyrotechnic operator".

Present law prohibits certain types of fireworks from being possessed, used, or sold in this state.

Proposed law provides that only items classified as 1.4G fireworks in compliance with American Pyrotechnics Association (APA) Standard 87-1A may be sold by a properly licensed retailer to the public.

Present law authorizes permissible items of fireworks to be sold at retail only from noon on June 16th through midnight on July 5th and noon on December 15th through midnight on January 1st of each calendar year.

Proposed law retains present law but changes the beginning time for sales to commence from noon to 7:00 a.m.

Proposed law authorizes permissible items of fireworks to be sold at retail from 7:00 a.m. on the Thursday immediately prior to Ash Wednesday through midnight on Ash Wednesday of each calendar year.

Proposed law authorizes permissible items of fireworks to be sold at retail from 7:00 a.m. on the Tuesday immediately prior to Memorial Day through midnight on Memorial Day of each calendar year.

Proposed law authorizes permissible items of fireworks to be sold at retail from 7:00 a.m. on the Tuesday immediately prior to Labor Day through midnight on Labor Day of each calendar year.

Present law provides that a licensee whose license has expired for 2 years or more and makes application for a new license shall retake and pass the written examination to receive a renewed license.

Proposed law provides that a licensee in that circumstance shall receive a new license.

Present law provides a fee for a license of \$50 for a new license and \$25 for a license renewal.

Proposed law clarifies that the license is for a pyrotechnic operator, pyrotechnic special effects operator, and blaster and it increases the fees to \$200 for a new license and \$100 for a renewal.

Present law provides for requirements to make a Class C public display and for licensing to make such a display.

Proposed law repeals the requirements for Class C public displays and licensing.

Present law provides requirements for a permit application for a Class C display, public display, or proximate display of fireworks.

Proposed law removes requirements for Class C public displays, and proposed law adds the requirement for public displays or proximate displays to have a current certificate of insurance issued to the state fire marshal showing general liability coverage in the amount of one million dollars.

Present law provides an application fee for a public display or proximate display permit of \$100, and a \$25 fee for a Class C public display permit.

Proposed law provides for a \$200 fee for public display or proximate display, and a \$100 fee for renewal of that permit. Proposed law removes the fee for a Class C public display.

Present law provides that the state fire marshal may promulgate rules and regulations regarding public displays, proximate displays, and Class C displays.

Proposed law removes the reference to Class C displays.

Present law provides for a retailer a \$100 fee for a permit to sell fireworks.

Proposed law increases the fee to \$250.

Proposed law makes it unlawful for any person to purchase fireworks from a distributor without first obtaining a valid retail permit issued by the state fire marshal.
