ACT 875 (HB 1100)

2026 Regular Session

New law repeals requirements for enriching bread and flour sold in this state.

Prior law required bread and flour sold in this state to be enriched with vitamins in certain amounts.

Prior law required enriched flour and bread to be properly labeled in accordance with state and federal law.

Prior law exempted certain flour and bread products and transactions from requirements of prior law including specific commercial uses, whole wheat products, toll milling, and on-farm use.

Prior law authorized the La. Dept. of Health (LDH) to conduct inspections, collect samples, and investigate facilities involved in flour and bread production and distribution.

Prior law authorized LDH to temporarily suspend enrichment requirements during ingredient shortages and to reinstate them when the shortage ends.

Prior law authorized LDH to adopt, amend, and rescind rules and regulations necessary to implement provisions of prior law related to enriched flour.

Prior law required publication of notices, rules, and orders in newspapers across three regions of the state and allowed LDH to set the effective date.

Prior law established penalties for violations, including fines, imprisonment, or both.

New law repeals prior law.

Effective August 1, 2026.
