Miller

New law prohibits civil and criminal liability for the use of Naloxone and other opioid antagonists solely on the basis that any labeled shelf-life end date for such product has passed.

New law prohibits civil or criminal liability for any person acting in good faith who furnishes or administers Naloxone or another opioid antagonist to an individual reasonably believed to be undergoing an opioid-related drug overdose except in the event of gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct.

New law prohibits healthcare professionals from disciplinary action by professional licensing boards when granted civil and criminal immunity under the proposed provisions.

New law defines the term "shelf-life end date".

New law mandates that a federally certified healthcare provider, facility, or entity comply with federal regulations and requirements regarding prohibiting the prescribing, dispensing, distributing, furnishing, or administering drugs whose shelf-life end date has passed.

Effective upon signature of governor (May 15, 2026).
