Existing law provides for fees charged by the secretary of state.

Existing law provides for fees for domestic business corporations and limited liability companies.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$75 for filing and recording corporation articles of incorporation, articles of amendment, articles of restatement, articles of domestication, articles of charter surrender, articles of nonprofit conversion, articles of nonprofit domestication and conversion, articles of dissolution, articles of revocation of dissolution, articles of reinstatement, articles of merger or share exchange, abandonment proceedings, simplified articles of termination, and articles of correction.

New law increases the fee to \$95.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$100 for filing and recording limited liability company articles of organization, amended articles of organization, dissolution proceedings, termination of dissolution proceedings, reinstatement proceedings, merger proceedings, conversions, and certificates of correction.

New law increases the fee to \$125.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$20 for filing any other document or issuing and sealing any other certificate required or permitted by existing law.

New law increases the fee to \$25.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$25 for a corporation's statement of change of registered agent or registered office, or both, the resignation of an agent or officer, appointment of a registered agent, change of domicile, appointment of new officers, directors, members, or managers, and change of address for agents, officers, directors, members, or managers.

New law increases the fee to \$30.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$25 dollars for a supplemental initial report for a limited liability company.

New law increases the fee to \$30.

Prior law provided that the fee for annual reports was \$30.

New law increases the fee to \$35.

Existing law provides for fees for domestic nonprofit corporations.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$75 for filing and recording articles of incorporation, amended articles of incorporation, dissolution proceedings, termination of dissolution proceedings, reinstatement proceedings, merger proceedings, conversions, and certificates of correction.

New law increases the fee to \$95.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$20 for issuing and sealing any other certificate required or permitted by existing law.

New law increases the fee to \$25.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$25 for the resignation of an agent or officer; appointment of a registered agent; change of domicile; appointment of new officers or directors; and change of address for agents, officers, or directors.

New law increases the fee to \$30.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$150 for filing and recording applications for authority on limited liability companies, amended applications, withdrawal proceedings, termination of withdrawal proceedings, reinstatement proceedings, merger proceedings, and certificates of correction.

New law increases the fee to \$185.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$20 for issuing and sealing any other certificate required or permitted by existing law.

New law increases the fee to \$25.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$25 for the resignation of an agent or officer; appointment of a registered agent; change of domicile; appointment of new officers, directors, members, or managers; and change of address for agents, officers, directors, members, or managers.

New law increases the fee to \$30.

Prior law provided that the fee for annual reports was \$30.

New law increases the fee to \$35.

Existing law provides for fees for partnerships and registered limited liability partnerships.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$150 for filing of partnership forms and filing of amendments of a foreign partnership and for the termination of the registration of a foreign partnership.

New law increases the fee to \$185.

Prior law provided that the fee for partnerships was \$100 for filing a contract of partnership of a domestic partnership or a registered limited liability partnership, and filing an amendment, merger, consolidation, or termination of a domestic partnership.

New law increases the fee to \$125.

Prior law provided that the fee for registered limited liability partnerships was \$100 for filing original or renewal forms, conversions to and from a registered limited liability company, and merger or consolidation of a registered limited liability partnership.

New law increases the fee to \$125.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$20 for additional certificates for partnerships or additional certificates for registered limited liability partnerships.

New law increases the fee to \$25.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$30 for annual reports for partnerships.

New law increases the fee to \$35.

Existing law provided for the fees for trade names, trademarks, and service marks.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$75 for registering, renewing, assigning, or terminating a trade name, trademark, or service mark.

New law increases the fee to \$95.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$15 for issuing a copy of any trade name, trademark, or service mark document and for sealing and certifying to correctness of a trade name, trademark, or service mark document on file.

New law increases the fee to \$20.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$20 for additional certificates.

New law increases the fee to \$25.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$100 for conversion from or to a partnership, including the conversion of a limited liability company from or to a partnership.

New law increases the fee to \$125.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$25 for collection of agency registration.

New law increases the fee to \$30.

Existing law provides for general fees.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$15 for additional certified copies.

New law increases the fee to \$20.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$20 for additional certificates.

New law increases the fee to \$25.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$25 for certified copies with amendments and for copies with amendments.

New law increases the fee to \$30.

Existing law provides for special fees.

Prior law provided for a fee of \$50 fee for expedited "while you wait" service and for receipt of service of process or other instruments.

New law increases the fee to \$60.

Prior law provided for a fee of \$30 for expedited 24 hour service.

New law increases the fee to \$35.

Prior law provided that the fee was \$60 for filing applications and issuing certificates for state franchises to offer cable service or video service in this state.

New law increases the fee to \$75.

Existing law provides for a fee of \$250 for filing renewals for home service contract providers.

New law adds that the fee shall also apply to filing amendments, financial statements, and reports.

Existing law provides for a fee of \$250 for filing renewals for motor vehicle service contract providers and for structured settlement purchase company registration.

New law adds that the fee shall also apply to filing amendments.

Effective October 1, 2026.
