2	To amend and reenact R.S. 56:39(A) and to enact R.S. 56:6(31), relative to importation of
3	certain animals; to require the Wildlife and Fisheries Commission to control the
4	importation and ownership of big exotic cats; to provide relative to certain penalties,
5	including forfeiture; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 56:39(A) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 56:6(31) is
8	hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	§6. Special powers and duties; statistics; rules and regulations; reports
10	The commission, through its secretary:
11	* * *
12	(31) Shall promulgate rules and regulations to control the importation and
13	private possession of big exotic cats including but not limited to tigers, lions,
14	leopards, jaguars, cheetahs, and hybrids resulting from cross-breeding of such cats.
15	The rules shall provide exceptions for big cats traditionally kept by colleges and
16	universities as school mascots, animal sanctuaries, zoos, wildlife research centers,
17	and scientific organizations. Such rules shall address Internet purchase of such
18	animals. Such rules shall also provide for permits for certain institutions and for
19	owners who can prove previous ownership. Violation of rules and regulations
20	adopted pursuant to the provisions of this Paragraph constitutes a class two violation
21	punishable as provided in R.S. 56:32.

1	§39. Forfeiture of quadrupeds, birds, and fish; Fish and Wildlife Violations Reward
2	Fund, creation and use of fund monies
3	A. In addition to all other penalties provided in this Chapter, violators subject
4	to the provisions of R.S. 56:31 through R.S. 56:37.1 shall upon conviction forfeit any
5	quadrupeds, birds, or other animals seized in connection with said violation.
