LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS. Designates Sazerac as the official cocktail of the city of New Orleans. (gov sig)

Report rejects House amendments which would have:

1. Designated the Sazerac as the official state cocktail instead of the official cocktail of the city of New Orleans.

Report amends the bill to:

1. Makes technical change in the bill's citation.

Digest of the bill as proposed by the Conference Committee

Murray (SB 6)

<u>Proposed law</u> establishes Sazerac as the official cocktail of the city of New Orleans and authorizes its use on official documents and with the insignia of the city of New Orleans.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
