

Existing law creates the Louisiana Sexual Assault Task Force within the Department of Justice, office of the attorney general, and provides for its membership, chairman, meetings, and duties. Requires that the task force examine issues relating to forensic examination of sexual assault victims and investigation of sexual assault cases.

Prior law required that the task force report its findings and recommendations to the governor, the president of the Senate, and the speaker of the House of Representatives no later than December 31, 2006. New law extends the report deadline to December 31, 2009.

Existing law requires that the task force terminate 60 days after the report of findings and recommendations have been submitted. New law retains this provision and further repeals provisions regarding the task force on July 1, 2010.

Effective upon signature of the governor (June 25, 2008).
