MARRIAGE: Prohibits the recognition or validity of any marriage between persons of the same sex lawfully entered into in another jurisdiction and provides for the effect of such marriages

7	for any purpose, including the assertion of any right or claim as a result

<u>Present law</u> prohibits persons of the same sex contracting marriage with each other.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and further provides that a purported marriage between persons of the same sex contracted in another state shall be governed by the provisions of Title II of Book IV of the Civil Code.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a purported marriage between persons of the same sex violates strong public policy of the state of Louisiana and such a marriage contracted in another state shall not be recognized in this state for any purpose.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Civil Law</u> <u>and Procedure</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

- 1. Changes provisions of <u>proposed law</u> to require that marriages between persons of the same sex contracted in another state be governed by Title II of Book IV of the Civil Code.
- 2. Adds provision relative to public policy of same sex marriages and that any such marriage shall not be recognized in this state.
