CRIME: Amends the definition of negligent injuring and negligent homicide to include attacks by dogs or other animals

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 14:32(A) and 39 and to enact R.S. 14:32(C)(3), relative to 3 certain crimes involving criminal negligence; to amend the definition of negligent 4 homicide to include the killing of a human being by a dog or other animal; to amend 5 the definition of negligent criminal injuring to include an injury caused by a dog or 6 other animal; and to provide for related matters. 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 8 Section 1. The ownership of dangerous dogs has become an increasing problem in 9 Louisiana with many people injured or killed as a result of an encounter with a dangerous 10 dog. The Louisiana Legislature hereby finds that owners of dangerous dogs who fail to 11 properly confine or restrain them should be criminally responsible for the injuries their 12 animals cause to the citizens of this state. This Act shall be known as the "Luna McDaniel 13 Act" in honor of Mrs. Luna McDaniel, a resident of Ville Platte, Louisiana, who was killed 14 by an attack from a pit bull dog. 15 Section 2. R.S. 14:32(A) and 39 are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 16 14:32(C)(3) is hereby enacted to read as follows: 17 §32. Negligent homicide 18 A. Negligent homicide is <u>either of the following</u>: 19 (1) the The killing of a human being by criminal negligence. 20 (2) The killing of a human being by a dog or other animal. 21
