PORTS/HARBORS/TERMINALS: Provides with respect to the Alexandria Regional Port

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 34:335.1, 335.2, 335.3(A), and 335.4(A), and to enact R.S. 34:
3	335.7 through 335.9, relative to the Alexandria Regional Port; to provide with
4	respect to the port's territorial boundaries; to provide with respect to the composition
5	of the board of commissioners; to provide for term limits; to provide for a method
6	for filling vacancies of the board; to provide for additional powers of the board; to
7	authorize the port to acquire land under certain circumstances; and to provide for
8	related matters.
9	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
10	as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
11	Louisiana.
12	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
13	Section 1. R.S. 34:335.1, 335.2, 335.3(A), and 335.4(A) are hereby amended and
14	reenacted and R.S. 34:335.7 through 335.9 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
15	PART VII-B. ALEXANDRIA REGIONAL PORT
16	§335.1. Creation and territorial limits
17	The Alexandria Regional Port hereinafter referred referred to in this Part as
18	the "port", is hereby created as a political subdivision of the state. , and its territorial
19	limits shall be concurrent with that of the municipal limits of the city of Alexandria

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2	Parish, except that its authority and jurisdiction shall not include any private ports.
3	§335.2. Board of commissioners; membership; officers; meetings
4	A. The port shall be governed by a board of commissioners referred to in this
5	Part as the "board", and shall be composed of eight seven members, who shall serve
6	without compensation and who shall be appointed for terms composed as follows:
7	(1) Five Three of the commissioners members shall be appointed by the
8	mayor of the city of Alexandria and confirmed shall be subject to confirmation by
9	the Alexandria City Council. Each commissioner member appointed pursuant to this
10	Paragraph shall be a citizen of the United States, a qualified voter of the state of
11	Louisiana, and a resident of the city of Alexandria.
12	(2) Three Four of the commissioners members shall be appointed as follows:
13	(a) One Two of the commissioner members shall be appointed at large by the
14	parish governing authority of Rapides Parish by the mayor of the city of Pineville.
15	Each member appointed pursuant to this Subparagraph shall be a citizen of the
16	United States, a qualified voter of the state of Louisiana, and a resident of the city
17	of Pineville or a resident of Ward Eleven of Rapides Parish.
18	(b) One Two commissioners members shall be appointed at large by the
19	parish governing authority of Grant Rapides Parish. One of such members
20	commissioners shall be a citizen of the United States and a resident of Rapides Parish
21	residing south of the Red River. One of such members shall be a citizen of the
22	United States and a resident of Rapides Parish residing north of the Red River.
23	(c) One commissioner appointed at large by the parish governing authority
24	of Avoyelles Parish.
25	B. One of the commissioners initially appointed by the mayor shall serve an
26	initial term of one year. Two of the commissioners initially appointed by the mayor
27	shall serve an initial term of two years. Two of the commissioners initially
28	appointed by the mayor shall serve an initial term of three years. Thereafter, the
29	successors to each of the commissioners appointed by the mayor shall be appointed

The boundaries of the port shall be coterminous with the boundaries of Rapides

Commission shall serve terms concurrent with their terms on that commission. On July 1, 2009, the term of each member appointed by the governing authorities of Grant Parish and Avoyelles Parish shall terminate. The three presently seated members appointed by the mayor of the city of Alexandria shall continue to serve during the remainder of the term of the appointing authority. The member appointed by the governing authority of Rapides Parish serving on July 9, 2009, shall continue to serve during the remainder of the term of the appointing authority. The additional member appointed by the governing authority of Rapides Parish pursuant to Subparagraph (A)(2)(b) of this Section and each member appointed by the mayor of the city of Pineville shall serve a term concurrent with the term of the respective appointing authority.

C. The membership of said board shall serve without compensation for its services to the board, but it shall be entitled to reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in the performance of its duties.

C.D. In the event that any commissioner ceases to be a commissioner for any reason, his successor shall be appointed in the same manner as the original appointment and shall serve for the remainder of the unexpired term. Any vacancy in the membership of the board occurring by reason of the expiration of the term of the office, or by reason of death, resignation, disqualification, or otherwise, shall be filled by the respective appointing authority within thirty days after receipt by such party of written notification of the vacancy. In the event that the respective appointing authority fails to fill the vacancy within thirty days after receipt of written notification of the vacancy, the board shall appoint an interim successor to serve on the board until the position is filled by the respective appointing authority responsible for the appointment of such member.

D. E. The board of commissioners shall elect from among its members a president, who shall have no vote except in the event of a tie vote, a vice president, a secretary, and a treasurer, whose respective duties shall be prescribed by the board.

At the option of the board of commissioners, the offices of the secretary and
treasurer may be held by one person. The board of commissioners shall meet in
regular session once each month and shall also meet in special session at the call of
the president of the commission or on the written request of five four members of the
board. A majority of the members of the board of commissioners, not including
vacancies, shall constitute a quorum, and all actions or resolutions of the board shall
be approved by the affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the members of the
board at the meeting. The board of commissioners shall prescribe rules governing
its meetings and shall fix a place at which the meetings shall be held.
F. However, no action of the board shall be authorized on any of the
following matters unless approved by a majority of the total membership of the
board:
(1) Adoption of bylaws and other rules and regulations for conduct of port
business.
(2) Hiring or firing of the port administrator or executive director.
(3) The incurring of funded, general, or bonded debt, levy of taxes, and call
for any tax or other election.
(4) Adoption or amendment of the annual budget.
(5) Sale, lease, or alienation of real property or improvements.
G. Any member who misses fifty percent of the board's meetings, regular
and special, in any given calendar year shall be disqualified and removed
automatically from office and that person's position shall be vacant as of the first day
of the succeeding calendar year. Such vacated position shall be filled in the same
manner as the original appointment for the balance of the vacated term. The former
member shall not be eligible for reappointment until expiration of the balance of the
vacated term.
§335.3. Authority, powers, and duties of board; officers; agents
A. The board of commissioners shall exercise the powers herein referred to
herein conferred upon it within the port area, consisting of the entire city of

Alexandria, including the port facility owned by the city of Alexandria all port property and within its territorial boundaries referenced in the provisions contained in R.S. 34:335.1, excluding any privately owned port facility.

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§335.4. Authority to levy and collect taxes; issuance of bonds

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A. The board of commissioners, when authorized to do so by a vote of a majority of the electors residing in the port territorial boundaries of the port and qualified to vote and voting at an election for such purpose in accordance with law, may levy annually on all property situated within the territorial boundaries of the port subject to taxation an ad valorem tax not to exceed ten mills on the dollar. The board of commissioners, upon its own initiative, may call a special election and submit to the qualified electors of the port the question of authorizing the levy of such a tax. The board of commissioners shall call such a special election when requested to do so by a petition in writing signed by at least one-fourth of the qualified electors eligible to vote at such election. These special taxes shall be levied, assessed, and collected on the property within the port under the same methods, terms, and conditions and at the same time as state and parish taxes are levied, assessed, and collected. These taxes shall be secured by the same liens upon the property subject to taxation within the port as taxes for state and parish purposes. The property subject to any taxes within said port shall be sold for failure to pay the same in the same manner as property is sold for delinquent state, parish, and other taxes under the laws of the state.

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§335.7. Acquisition of lands; public aid

A. The board of commissioners is authorized to acquire by purchase, donation, expropriation, appropriation, or otherwise any lands in the district needed for railways, wharves, sheds, buildings, canals, channels, and other facilities required for the operation of the board and to be owned and operated by the port. The board

1 of commissioners may also provide that payments for such lands be made out of 2 funds under its control not otherwise specifically appropriated. 3 B. The board of commissioners is further authorized to receive by gift, grant, 4 donation, or otherwise, any sum of money, aid, or assistance from the United States, the state of Louisiana, or any of the political subdivisions thereof, for the purpose of 5 carrying out the objects and purposes of this Chapter. 6 7 C. In addition to its power to acquire such property in the various modes set 8 out in this Section, the board shall also have power to expropriate property within its 9 territorial limits in the same manner applicable to other port commissions under the 10 provisions of R.S. 19:141 et seq. 11 §335.8. Present rights of Rapides Parish 12 Nothing herein contained shall be construed to deprive the parish of Rapides or its governing authority of any rights or powers which they presently have or exert 13 14 within the territorial limits of the port, or to confer further police power upon the 15 port. 16 §335.9. Transitional 17 R.S. 34:335.1 through 335.9 shall be construed as a continuation of and as 18 a substitute for the provisions of Article VI, Section 32 of the Louisiana Constitution 19 of 1921, and not as new enactments, and shall be amended or repealed only in 20 accordance with Article VI, Section 43 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974. 21 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2009; if vetoed by the governor 22 and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 23 2009, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.

Dixon HB No. 774

Abstract: Provides relative to the territorial boundaries, governance, powers, duties, vacancies, meetings, land acquisition, expropriation of property, rights and powers of Rapides Parish governing authority within the territorial boundaries of the port.

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CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Present law</u> creates the Alexandria Port Authority and provides for an eight-member board to serve without compensation, five members appointed by the mayor of Alexandria. Provides that three members shall be the appointees to the Red River Waterway Commission representing the parishes of Rapides, Grant, and Avoyelles.

<u>Present law</u> established the authority as coterminous with the city of Alexandria.

<u>Present law</u> requires election of officers (president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer from among its members. Allows the board to combine the offices of secretary and treasurer.

Provides the president shall have no vote except in the event of a tie vote. Requires the board to meet regularly once monthly and in special meeting at the call of the president or on written request of five members.

Provides a majority of the members constitute a quorum. Further requires all actions and resolutions be approved by an affirmative vote of at least a majority of those attending the meeting.

Provides that the board prescribe its rules of governing its meetings and requires the board to fix a meeting place.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the board to regulate commerce and traffic within the area and allow for the construction of wharves, locks, canals, warehouses, elevators, docks, sheds, and other buildings necessary to conduct the business of the port.

<u>Present law</u> provides for contracting and leasing authority within political subdivisions including the city of Alexandria, for the management and operation of port and ancillary facilities, including an industrial park associated with the port.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the levy and collection of taxes by vote of the people not to exceed 10 mills.

<u>Present law</u> requires the tax collector to collect and remit taxes on a monthly basis to the board and authorizes the issuance of revenue bonds not to exceed 10 million dollars and the issuance of general obligation bonds with voter approval.

<u>Present law</u> requires advertisement of the sale of the bonds in the parish where the parish is domiciled and in either New Orleans, LA, or New York, N.Y.

<u>Present law</u> exempts the port from compliance with the provisions of R.S. 43:111, relative to advertising.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the territorial limits of the port being concurrent with the municipal limits of the city of Alexandria <u>to</u> the boundaries of the port being coterminous with the boundaries of Rapides Parish, except that its port authority shall not include any private ports.

<u>Proposed law</u> reduces the membership of the board of commissioners <u>from</u> 8 to 7 as follows:

- (1) Three members appointed by the mayor of the city of Alexandria.
- (2) Two members appointed by the mayor of the city of Pineville each of whom shall be a resident of the city of Pineville or a resident of Ward 11 of Rapides Parish.
- (3) Two members appointed at large by the parish governing authority of Rapides Parish, which one of the members appointed at large shall reside south of the Red River and the other member appointed at large shall reside north of the Red River.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for term limits and provides for filling board vacancies.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that four members of the board <u>instead</u> of five members can request in writing to call a special meeting of the board. Further provides that a majority of the members of the board <u>not including</u> vacancies shall constitute a quorum.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that no action of the board be authorized on any of the following matters unless approved by a majority of the total membership of the board:

- (1) Adoption of bylaws, and other rules and regulations for conduct of port business.
- (2) Hiring or firing of the port administrator or executive director.
- (3) The incurring of funded, general or bonded debt, levy of taxes, and call for any tax or other election.
- (4) Adoption or amendment of the annual budget.
- (5) Sale, lease, or alienation of real property or improvements.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that if a board member misses 50% of the board's meetings whether these meetings are regular or special meetings, the member shall be disqualified and removed from office. Provides that the vacated position on the board shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

<u>Proposed law</u> additional powers of the board include:

- (1) Use of authority on all port property within the boundaries of Rapides Parish, except that its port authority shall not include any private ports.
- (2) Acquire by purchase, donation, expropriation, appropriation, or any land in the district needed for railways, wharves, sheds, buildings, canals, channels, and other facilities to be owned and operated by the port.
- (3) Receive by gift, grant, or donation, any sum of money, aid or assistance from the United States, state of La., or any of the political subdivision for carrying out the objects and purposes of the port.
- (4) Power to expropriate property within its territorial limits in the same manner applicable to other port commissions under provisions of R.S. 19:141 et seq.
