D. Any violation of this Section shall constitute a non-moving moving

violation. A law enforcement officer shall enforce the provisions of this Section as

a secondary action and a driver may be cited only if stopped for a moving violation.

## **DIGEST**

## B. Gautreaux (SB 9)

<u>Present law</u> provides that the traffic violation of texting while driving a motor vehicle shall be enforced only as a "secondary action" when the officer detains a driver for another alleged violation.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits persons 17 years of age or younger to operate a motor vehicle while using any "wireless telecommunications device" to engage in a call or write, send or read a text-based communication as a non-moving violation, and also authorizes enforcement only as a "secondary action".

<u>Proposed law</u> removes these provisions, thereby making them a primary offense for which a driver may be stopped.

Effective August 15, 2010.

(Amends R.S. 32:300.5(C)(4) and 300.7(D))

<u>Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works to the original bill.</u>

1. Also makes using a "wireless telecommunications device" by persons 17 years of age or younger while operating a motor vehicle a primary offense.
