KEYWORD AND SUMMARY AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

TRAFFIC. Makes texting while driving by all drivers and using a cell phone while driving by those seventeen and under a primary offense for which a driver maybe stopped. (8/15/10)

SUMMARY OF HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO THE SENATE BILL

1. Legislative Bureau amendments.

DIGEST OF THE SENATE BILL AS RETURNED TO THE SENATE

<u>Present law</u> provides that the traffic violation of texting while driving a motor vehicle shall be enforced only as a "secondary action" when the officer detains a driver for another alleged violation. <u>Present law</u> also prohibits persons 17 years of age or younger from operating a motor vehicle while using any "wireless telecommunications device" to engage in a call or write, send or read a text-based communication, but further provides that this is a non-moving violation and authorizes enforcement of above only as a "secondary action".

<u>Proposed law</u> removes <u>present law</u> provisions limiting enforcement as a "secondary action" and non-moving violation, thereby making a violation a primary offense for which a driver may be stopped.

Effective August 15, 2010.
