STUDENT/LOANS-SCHOLARSHP: Requests the Bd. of Regents to study and report on certain issues relative to the high school core curriculum requirements for students to be eligible for a TOPS Opportunity, Performance, or Honors award

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To urge and request the Board of Regents, in consultation with certain others, to study the
3	provisions of enacted House Bill No. 1491 of the 2010 Regular Session, relative to
4	the high school core curriculum requirements for certain students to be eligible for
5	a Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) Opportunity, Performance, or
6	Honors award, and determine if requiring a student to successfully complete at least
7	nineteen units of a specified curriculum beginning with the 2013-2014 school year
8	will have a disparate impact on students attending state-approved nonpublic schools;
9	to request that the board make recommendations as to how best to resolve any such
10	disparate impact, if any; to provide for a written report on study findings and
11	recommendations to be made to the House Committee on Education; and to provide
12	for related matters.
13	WHEREAS, the legislature has enacted House Bill No. 1491 of the 2010 Regular
14	Session relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS); and
15	WHEREAS, this legislation provides, beginning with the 2013-2014 school year and
16	thereafter, that certain students must successfully complete at least nineteen units of a
17	specified high school core curriculum to be eligible for a TOPS Opportunity, Performance,
18	or Honors award; and
19	WHEREAS, it is not uncommon for a student who is attending a nonpublic high
20	school that is approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to have

to take for assorted purposes one or more courses not required of a student attending a public
high school.

3 THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 4 Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the Board of Regents, in consultation 5 with the Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission, the State Board of Elementary 6 and Secondary Education and the board's advisory Nonpublic School Commission, the 7 Taylor Foundation, Citizens for Educational Choice, and others as deemed appropriate by 8 the Board of Regents, to study the provisions of enacted House Bill No. 1491 of the 2010 9 Regular Session, relative to the high school core curriculum requirements for certain 10 students to be eligible for a TOPS Opportunity, Performance, or Honors award, and 11 determine if requiring a student to successfully complete at least nineteen units of the 12 specified curriculum beginning with the 2013-2014 school year will have a disparate impact on students attending state-approved nonpublic schools. 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents shall make 15 recommendations as to how best to resolve any such disparate impact, if any.

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Regents shall report in writing on

17 study findings and recommendations to the House Committee on Education by not later than

- 18 sixty days prior to the start of the 2011 Regular Session.
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution shall be transmitted
- 20 to the chairman of the Board of Regents and to the commissioner of higher education.

Student Financial Assistance Commission, the State Bd. of Elementary and Secondary Education and the board's advisory Nonpublic School Commission, the Taylor Foundation, Citizens for Educational Choice, and others as deemed appropriate by the Bd. Regents) to study the provisions of enacted HB No. 1491 of the 2010 R.S., relative to the high school core curriculum requirements for certain students to be eligible for a Taylor Opportunity Programs for Students (TOPS) Opportunity, Performance, or Honors award, and determine if requiring a student to successfully complete at least 19 units of the specified curriculum beginning with the 2013-2014 school year will have a disparate impact on students attending state-approved nonpublic schools.

Provides that the Bd. of Regents shall make recommendations as to how best to resolve any such disparate impact, if any.

Also provides that the Bd. of Regents shall report in writing on study findings and recommendations to the House education committee prior to the start of the 2011 RS.
