ENVIRONMENT: Provides for litter abatement and enforcement and education programs

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2506(A)(introductory paragraph) and (B) and 2507(A), R.S.
3	32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), and (6), (B)(1), (2), and (7)(e)(i)(cc) and (ee) and (ii)(cc) and
4	(ee), R.S. 36:605(B)(4)(a), and R.S. 47:463.43(A), (D), and (E), to enact R.S.
5	56:10(B)(14), and to repeal R.S. 30:2504 and 2511, R.S. 36:609(B)(4), Section 3 of
6	Act No. 527 of the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 363 of the 2004
7	Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 190 of the 2007 Regular Session of the
8	Legislature, and R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), (6), B(1), (2), (7)(e)(i)(aa), (dd)(I),
9	(e)(ii)(aa), and (dd)(I) as amended by Act No of the 2011 First Extraordinary
10	Session of the Legislature, relative to litter abatement, enforcement, and education;
11	to provide for the Louisiana Environmental Education Commission; to provide for
12	the responsibility and duties of the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; to provide
13	litter abatement and enforcement; to provide for education programs; to abolish the
14	environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries;
15	to provide for special license plates; to provide for the disposition of certain funds
16	collected from driver's license issuance and renewal and special license plates; and
17	to provide for related matters.
18	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
19	Section 1. R.S. 30:2506(A)(introductory paragraph) and (B) and 2507(A) are hereby
20	amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1	§2506. Curriculum framework
2	A. The commission and the office of environmental education shall work
3	with the Department of Education to develop a curriculum framework for
4	establishing environmental education programs in all public and private elementary
5	and secondary schools. The program shall integrate environmental concepts and
6	skills into regular curricula, which include:

8	B. The commission and the office of environmental education shall work
9	with the Department of Education to implement an environmental education program
0	in grades K through twelve.

12	§2507. Pre-service teacher education
13	A. The commission and the office of environmental education shall work
14	with members of teacher education institutions, colleges and universities, and the
15	Board of Regents to develop guidelines for incorporating environmental education
16	into teacher education requirements.

18	Section 2. R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), and (6), (B)(1), (2), and (7)(e)(i)(cc) and (ee)
19	and (ii)(cc) and (ee) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
20	§412. Amount of fees; credit or refund; duration of license; disbursement of funds;
21	renewal by mail or electronic commerce of Class "D" or "E" drivers' licenses;
22	disposition of certain fees; exception
23	A.(1) Every applicant for a Class "D" driver's license, or for a renewal of a
24	Class "D" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a
25	population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall
26	pay for such basic license a fee of twenty-eight dollars and fifty cents. Seven dollars
27	and forty-three cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and

Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the

office of environmental education <u>litter abatement and education account which is</u> created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(2) The fee for Class "D" drivers' licenses, or renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be thirty-six dollars, ten dollars of which fee shall be payable by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. One dollar and twenty-three cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the office of environmental education litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(5) Every applicant for a Class "E" driver's license, or for a renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of thirteen dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of such basic license. Three dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the office of environmental education litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(6) The fee for a Class "E" driver's license, or renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be thirteen dollars and fifty cents, two dollars and fifty cents of which fee shall be paid by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension funds of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. Two dollars and fifty cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the office of environmental education litter abatement and education

4	B.(1) Every applicant for a Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's
5	license, or for a renewal of a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's

7	of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic
8	license a fee of forty-one dollars. Ten dollars and eighty cents of the fee shall be
9	paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall
10	be forwarded by the department to the office of environmental education litter
11	abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund
12	through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).
13	(2) The fee for a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license,
14	or for the renewal of a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license,
15	issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four
16	hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be fifty-one dollars, ten dollars
17	of which fee shall be paid by the department to the board of trustees of the police
18	pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. Ten dollars of the fee
19	shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee
20	shall be forwarded by the department to the office of environmental education litter
21	abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund
22	through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

Section 3. R.S. 36:605(B)(4)(a) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

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2	§605. Powers and duties of the secretary of wildlife and fisheries

4	B. The secretary shall have authority to:

6	(4)(a) Enforce the laws of the state and rules and regulations relative to
7	wildlife and fisheries, including but not limited to laws, rules, and regulations
8	relative to illegal hunting, fishing, and trapping, boating safety regulations, and the
9	prohibited methods, times, or seasons, and locations therefor, including the illegal
10	transportation, shipping, and sale of wildlife, fish, and other aquatic life and fur-
11	bearing animals and alligators, and including the illegal possession of wildlife, game,
12	or fish and other aquatic life, and develop and implement litter abatement,
13	enforcement, and awareness programs and toward these ends shall appoint not less
14	than twenty-five wildlife agents, whose entire time, under the direction of the
15	secretary, shall be devoted to the performance of their official duties as prescribed
16	by law. Notwithstanding R.S. 40:5, the secretary shall have authority to enforce the
17	laws specifically assigned by statute to the Department of Health and Hospitals and
18	any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder for the purpose of regulating the
19	harvesting, processing, or distribution of molluscan shellfish.

21	Section 4. R.S. 47:463.43(A), (D), and (E) are hereby amended and reenacted to read
22	as follows:
23	§463.43. Special license plates; environmental education division
24	A. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall establish a special
25	prestige motor vehicle license plate for the environmental education division within
26	by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife, R.S. 30:2503 et seq
27	for the purposes provided in R.S. 56:10(B)(14). The license plates shall be restricted
28	to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans, and recreational vehicles.

1	D. The department shall collect the donation for each license plate and
2	forward the donation as provided in Subsection C of this Section to the
3	environmental education division Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. The one
4	dollar handling fee as provided in Subsection C of this Section shall be retained by
5	the department to offset the administrative costs. The funds received by the
6	environmental education division Department of Wildlife and Fisheries office of
7	wildlife pursuant to this Section shall be deposited in the Louisiana Environmental
8	Education Fund, R.S. 30:2511 litter abatement and education account which is
9	created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14),
10	and used solely for the purposes of that fund.
11	E. The secretary with the assistance of the environmental education division
12	shall establish such rules and regulations as are necessary to implement the
13	provisions of this Section including but not limited to rules and regulations
14	governing the collection and disbursement of the donation, the transfer and
15	disposition of such license plates, the colors available, and the design criteria. The
16	design shall include the use of the environmental education division logo.

24	(14) There is hereby created within the Conservation Fund a special account
25	known as the "litter abatement and education account" which shall consist of all
26	revenue collected from the sale of the environmental education license plate
27	provided for in R.S. 47:463.43; all revenue received from the Department of Public
28	Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles, pursuant to driver's license
29	issuance; funds from public or private donations and any other source which may

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specify deposit to this account; and any remaining balance in the Louisiana Environmental Education Fund as of August 15, 2011. The revenues shall be subject to the same requirements as provided for other revenues placed in the Conservation Fund in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. The funds in this account shall be used solely for litter abatement and enforcement; public service announcements; develop, review, and approve a plan for statewide environmental education and training of operators of vehicles regarding littering; to finance local littering enforcement activities in order to promote public safety, order, and general welfare by making the streets, roads, rivers, streams, bayous, lakes, waterways, and highways of Louisiana clean, safe, and free of debris, litter, and other material falling from or being thrown from vehicles; and to award grants to nonprofit organizations and public agencies for the development, dissemination, and assessment of such education programs. Section 6. R.S. 30:2504 and 2511 and R.S. 36:609(B)(4) and Section 3 of Act No. 527 of the 2003 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 363 of the 2004 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No.190 of the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature, and R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), (6), (B)(1), (2), (7)(e)(i)(aa), (dd)(I), (e)(ii)(aa), and (dd)(I) as amended by Act No. __ of the 2011 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature are hereby repealed in their entirety. Section 7. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2011; if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1,

Morris HB No. 292

Abstract: Provides for the Environmental Education Commission and the litter abatement and education account in the Conservation Fund.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the Environmental Education Commission in the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries, provides for the commission's powers and duties, and creates the office of environmental education within the office of wildlife, Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> except repeals the office of environmental education.

<u>Present law</u> provides for a \$1 fee on the fee charged for driver's licenses to be deposited into the La. Environmental Education Fund and to be used for public service announcements and for the education and training of drivers of motor vehicles regarding littering or to finance local littering enforcement activities until Aug. 15, 2011.

<u>Present law</u> creates a prestige motor vehicle environmental education license plate for the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries. Revenues received from the donations from the plates are deposited into the La. Environmental Education Fund to be used for the purposes of the Environmental Education Commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals La. Environmental Education Fund and replaces the fund with the "litter abatement and education account" within the Conservation Fund.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> except the funds from both sources, along with any public or private donations, shall be deposited into the "litter abatement and education account" within the Conservation Fund, and repeals driver's license fee sunset date.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that funds in the account shall be used solely for litter abatement and enforcement; public service announcements; develop, review, and approve a plan for statewide environmental education and training of operators of vehicles regarding littering; to finance local littering enforcement activities in order to promote public safety, order, and general welfare by making the streets, roads, rivers, streams, bayous, lakes, waterways, and highways of La. clean, safe, and free of debris, litter, and other material falling from or being thrown from vehicles; and to award grants to nonprofit organizations and public agencies for the development, dissemination, and assessment of such education programs.

Act No. __ of the 2011 First Extraordinary Session amended various provisions of R.S. 32:412, of which are being repealed by the <u>proposed law</u>.
