2	To enact R.S. 32:402(C)(4), relative to motor vehicles; to provide licensing exception to
3	certain operators of a mobile command post vehicle; and to provide for related
4	matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 32:402(C)(4) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	§402. All drivers must secure license; exception; emergency vehicle exceptions;
8	military personnel exceptions; emergency command post vehicle
9	exception; violations

12	(4) Notwithstanding any provision of this Section or any other law to the
13	contrary, the only driver's license required of a full-time, regularly paid
14	operator of an emergency command post vehicle which would otherwise meet
15	the definition of a commercial motor vehicle, and who is employed by the
16	Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness or a
17	parish office of emergency preparedness, shall be a Class "E" driver's license

2	vehicle shall be equipped with audible and visual signals as required by Federal
3	Motor Carrier Safety Administration rules.

5	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
6	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
7	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
8	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
9	effective on the day following such approval.

## DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> requires every person who operates a motor vehicle which is designated as being in either Class "A", "B", "C", "D", or "E" by R.S. 32:408 to secure the appropriately classified driver's license with all necessary endorsements before driving or operating any such motor vehicle on any public street, road, or highway of this state.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides a licensing exception from <u>present law</u> for a full-time, regularly paid operator of an emergency command post vehicle which meets the definition of a commercial motor vehicle and who is employed by the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness or a parish office of emergency preparedness.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that such operator is only required to have a Class "E" driver's license.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
