ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES. Requires spouses of liquor license applicants to provide their fingerprints with the applicant's application. (gov sig)

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 26:80(H) and 280(H), relative to alcohol permits; to require
3	spouses of persons submitting alcohol permit applications to submit their fingerprints
4	in their spouses application; to require partners, stockholders and members of limited
5	liability companies and their spouses to submit their fingerprints with the alcohol
6	permit applicant's application; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 26:80(H) and 280(H) are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
9	follows:

12	H.(1) In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a permit, the

(2) In order to determine the applicant's suitability for an alcoholic beverage 6 7 permit, In order to determine the suitability of an applicant, the office of alcohol 8 and tobacco control shall require the applicant's spouse, members of a 9 partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, the officers and 10 directors of a corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of 11 such a corporation or company and their spouses and all other persons required 12 13 to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant, the office of alcohol 14 and tobacco control shall require the applicant to furnish to the office of alcohol and tobacco control a full set of fingerprints to enable a criminal background 15 investigation to be conducted. The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall submit 16 the completed fingerprint card to the office of state police. The office of state police 17 is authorized to submit the fingerprints to the F.B.I. for a national criminal history 18

20 (3) The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall require a background 21 investigation of each applicant, the applicant's spouse, members of a partnership 22 recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, the officers and directors of a corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and members 23 24 of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such a corporation or company and their spouses and all other persons required to 25 possess the same qualifications of the applicant for an alcoholic beverage permit 26 27 by means of fingerprint checks by the office of state police and the F.B.I.

(4) In addition to the other requirements established by law, the submittal of
fingerprints shall be a prerequisite to the issuance of an <u>a permanent</u> alcoholic

3 (5) The office of state police shall require each applicant, the applicant's spouse, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their 4 spouses, officers and directors of a corporation and their spouses, the 5 stockholders of a corporation and the members of a limited liability company 6 7 owning more than five percent of such a corporation or company and their 8 spouses and all other persons required to possess the same qualifications 9 required of the applicant person applying for an alcoholic beverage permit 10 pursuant to this Chapter to be fingerprinted. Such fingerprints shall be available for 11 use by the office of state police and for transmittal to the F.B.I. for a national 12 criminal history record check. The information obtained from the national criminal 13 history record check conducted pursuant to this Section may be used by the office of alcohol and tobacco control to determine the applicant's eligibility for an alcoholic 14 15 beverage permit.

Qualifications of applicants for permits

19 H.(1) In order to determine the applicant's suitability for a permit, the applicant shall be fingerprinted. In order to determine their suitability, the 20 21 applicant, the applicant's spouse, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, officers and directors of a corporation and 22 their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and members of a limited 23 24 liability company owning more than five percent of such corporations and companies and their spouses and all other persons required to possess the same 25 qualifications required of the applicant shall be fingerprinted. 26 If no 27 disqualifying record is identified at the state level, the fingerprints shall be forwarded by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Public Safety Services, office 28 29 of state police, to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (F.B.I.) for a national criminal

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history record check.

2 (2) In order to determine the applicant's suitability for an alcoholic beverage permit, In order to determine the suitability of an applicant, the office of alcohol 3 and tobacco control shall require the applicant's spouse, members of a 4 5 partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, officers and directors of a corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation 6 7 and members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of 8 such corporations and companies and their spouses and all other persons 9 required to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant, the office 10 of alcohol and tobacco control shall require the applicant to furnish to the office of 11 alcohol and tobacco control a full set of fingerprints to enable a criminal background 12 investigation to be conducted. The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall submit 13 the completed fingerprint card to the office of state police. The office of state police is authorized to submit the fingerprints to the F.B.I. for a national criminal history 14 15 background check.

(3) The office of alcohol and tobacco control shall require a background 16 investigation of each applicant, the applicant's spouse, members of a partnership 17 recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, officers and directors of a 18 19 corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and the members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such 20 21 corporations or companies and their spouses and all other persons required to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant for an alcoholic 22 beverage permit by means of fingerprint checks by the office of state police and the 23 F.B.I. 24

(4) In addition to the other requirements established by law, the submittal of

13	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
14	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
15	by the governor, as provided in Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
16	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
17	effective on the day following such approval.

## DIGEST

Walsworth (SB 115)

<u>Present law</u> requires that all applicants for a liquor license submit their fingerprints when they submit their application.

<u>Present law</u> regarding high and low alcohol beverage permits, provides several qualification for applicants. Also requires that the spouse of an applicant meet the same qualifications.

<u>Proposed law</u> additionally requires that the spouses of all applicants for a liquor license, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, the officers and directors of a corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such a corporation or company and their spouses and all other persons required to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant to submit their fingerprints when the application for the permit is submitted.

<u>Proposed law</u> also requires that the spouses of all applicants, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, the officers and directors of a corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and members of a limited liability

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that the spouse of all applicants, members of a partnership recognized by Louisiana law and their spouses, the officers and directors of a corporation and their spouses, the stockholders of a corporation and members of a limited liability company owning more than five percent of such a corporation or company and their spouses and all other persons required to possess the same qualifications required of the applicant to undergo a national criminal backgound investigation.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
