Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the monies derived from such fees shall remain in the Louisiana Community and Technical 14 College System and shall not be deposited into the state general fund. Such 15 monies shall be used to lower the cost of electronic textbooks and instructional 16 17 materials to students. Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 18 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 19 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 20 21 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 22 effective on the day following such approval. ## **DIGEST**

Walsworth (SB 165)

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges to make every effort to ensure that electronic versions are available for all prescribed textbooks and other instructional materials and to develop a program for the encouragement and sale of such electronic course materials, in an effort to reduce the costs to students and provide a convenient means for students to purchase such course materials in a single transaction instead of purchasing content separately.

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Coding: Words which are struck through are deletions from existing law; words in **boldface type and underscored** are additions.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the board, beginning in the Fall 2011 semester and thereafter, to do the following:

- (1) Direct institutions under its management to clearly communicate the board's desire to increase the availability and accessibility of electronic textbooks and other instructional materials in community and technical colleges when inviting publishers to participate in the textbook selection process and encourage all publishers to provide electronic versions of the products they offer in addition to the printed version.
- (2) Adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary for the sale and distribution of electronic textbook content, or fractions of electronic textbook content, instructional material and assessments.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board to charge a single fee at registration for students opting to purchase electronic textbooks and other instructional materials. Provides, notwithstanding any law to the contrary, for monies derived from such fees to remain with LCTCS and not be deposited in the state general fund. Provides that such monies are to be used to lower the cost of electronic textbooks and instructional materials to students.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
